# **Adjudicators' Biographies**

Tom Stites (Kentucky), Thomas A. Stites recently retired as the Coordinator of Fine Arts for Owensboro Public Schools. During his time in Owensboro he led a dynamic growth in the fine arts program, ensuring every child had access to every art in every school. He was conductor of the Owensboro Youth Symphony Orchestra for twelve years and board member of the RiverPark Center. Previously Tom served thirty-one years as a high school band director with positions at Science Hill HS in Johnson City, TN, Marist School in Atlanta, GA, and Sylva-Webster HS in Sylva, NC. He holds degrees from Western Kentucky University and East Tennessee State University. He also served as music director and conductor of the Johnson City Symphony Orchestra.

His involvement in Kentucky arts education includes two years of work on College and Career

Pathways in the Arts for KDE, committees with the Arts Council, the creation of the Kentucky Arts Summit, hosted and led numerous arts professional developments with the Kennedy Center Partners in Education. He continues as an active adjudicator, clinician and speaker across the United States.

Concert highlights include performances at Carnegie Hall with the Owensboro Symphony Youth Orchestra, two concert bands in the New York Wind Band Festival at Carnegie Hall with Science Hill, the National Concert Band Festival in Indianapolis, IN, two performances at the Tennessee Music Educators Association state convention, and the National Adjudicators Invitational in Chattanooga, TN. National events include two appearances in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, two appearances in the Tournament of Roses Parade, the Hollywood Christmas Parade, the Orange Bowl Parade, the Festival of States, appearance on the "Today" show, and the Waikiki Holiday Parade.

He was recognized as a Kentucky Colonel (2023), chosen as the Kentucky Music Educators Administrator of the year (2013), named Science Hill HS Teacher of the year (2007), received the Johnson City Symphony Conductors Awards (1999), was chosen as one of the directors of the United States Army All-American Marching Band (2008), and served on the board of East Tennessee Band and Orchestra Association and TMEA.



Scott Carter (Texas), Scott M. Carter serves as Director of Bands at Frenship High School where he oversees the Frenship ISD band program. Mr. Carter conducts the Wind Ensemble, the Frenship Fine Arts Musicals, and is Director of the Tiger Marching Band. Bands under the direction of Mr. Carter consistently receive 1st division awards in UIL concert and sightreading evaluation and have participated in the UIL Texas State Marching Championships ten times.

Having served the Frenship ISD for 25 years, Mr. Carter has helped students and ensembles in the Frenship Band program place in the upper levels at regional and state competitions including national performances on National Public Radio's program "From the Top". Frenship has achieved recognition by placing at the state level of TMEA Honor Band competition, the national level of The Foundation for Music Education's "Mark of

Excellence", and in 2022 made history as the first-ever UIL Texas State Champion of Instrumental Chamber Music. In addition to winning two NTCA State Championships in winter guard, Frenship has twice been named as one of the "Top 100 Districts for Music Education", and has performed across the nation in Florida, Missouri, Colorado, Texas, and Hawaii.

Originally from San Saba, Texas, Mr. Carter received his Bachelor of Music degree from Texas Tech University in 1999. While attending Texas Tech, he proudly served for two years as Drum Major of the nationally famous "Goin' Band from Raiderland", which in 1999, received the Sudler Intercollegiate Marching Trophy. Mr. Carter currently serves as Vice-President of TMEA Region 16 and is an active clinician & adjudicator throughout Texas. Mr. Carter holds memberships in Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, National Band Association, and is an alumnus of the national band fraternity Kappa Kappa Psi. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in music education from Texas Tech and loves to travel and spend time with his family. He and his wife, Tammy, have one son and one daughter, and reside in Lubbock, Texas.



**Tye Ann Payne (Texas),** is an active teacher, consultant, clinician, and adjudicator with over 40 years experience as a Texas band director. Before her retirement from public schools, Ms. Payne taught at Charles B. Cook Middle School and Jersey Village High School in the Cypress-Fairbanks ISD, Houston. She also taught at Westwood Junior High School in the Richardson ISD, Dallas. She began her career at Spring Forest Middle School in the Spring Branch ISD, Houston.

Ms. Payne is a graduate of the University of Houston and a proud student of Eddie Green. Her bands have received consistent superior ratings and honors at concert and sight-reading contests and festivals. During her tenure at Westwood Junior High School, Ms. Payne was awarded the prestigious Sudler Cup of Honor presented by the John Philip Sousa Foundation for outstanding

achievements at the junior high level. Ms. Payne has been honored to serve her profession as a committee member for the UIL Prescribed Music List. She is a member of the Texas Bandmasters Association, the Texas Music Educators Association and the Texas Music Adjudicator's Association. She is also a member of Phi Beta Mu, a professional music fraternity that acknowledges excellence in teaching.

Ms. Payne is grateful to all who have made it possible for her to continue her profession after retirement. Ms. Payne believes that the importance of music education and performance in a child's development is unparalleled because of its powerful and everlasting impact upon our most human experiences.
