



2025 NMAA State Tennis Championships presented by Corley's Albuquerque Lincoln

La Cueva Boys Continue Their Streak & Farmington Girls Finish On Top


The La Cueva High School Boys Tennis program finished the season on top once again as the Bears claimed the Class 5A Title at the 2025 NMAA State Tennis Championships, presented by Corley's Albuquerque Lincoln. La Cueva beat Albuquerque High in the final by a score of 5-4. The Bears have won every state title since 2019, and all but one since 2014.

On the girls side, Farmington took top honors. The Lady Scorps beat La Cueva in the final 5-0. It's their first state championship since 2018.



Individually, sophomore Ketan Garg of La Cueva beat Albuquerque High's Mitchell Rocca in the Boys 5A Singles final 2-6, 6-4, 7-5. Organ Mountain freshman Savannah Reiman beat Cleveland's top seed Lily Walker to claim the Girls 5A Singles Title 6-1, 6-2. Reiman only lost 10 games in four victories over the two-day individuals tournament. It's the first state tennis title for Organ Mountain. Eldorado's Vivica Corley/Vianca Corley team dominated the Girls 5A Doubles bracket and

beat Carmen Valentino/Siena Valentino of Santa Fe in the final 6-0, 6-2. The team of Cristian Olson/Julian Olson from Albuquerque High won the Boys 5A Doubles Title beating James Evans/Isaiah Mayes of Hobbs 6-3, 6-4.



Albuquerque Academy Makes It A Boys/Girls Sweep Once Again

The Albuquerque Academy Boys and Girls dominated the Class A-4A competition once again at

the 2025 NMAA State Tennis Championships, presented by Corley's Albuquerque Lincoln. The Academy boys beat Santa Fe Prep in the final by a 5-2 count, making it 22 consecutive state titles for the Chargers. The Albuquerque Academy girls beat Robertson in the final with a score of 5-1. The Albuquerque Academy girls have won every state championship since 2019.

Individually, Albuquerque Academy's Austin Curtis beat top seed, and longtime friend, Henry Kaufman of Santa Fe Prep 2-6. 6-1, 7-5 in the Boys A-4A Singles Final. Avery Williams of Goddard claimed the Girls A-4A Singles Title for the second straight year after beating Academy's Nishta Koli 6-3, 6-3. The Albuquerque Academy girls team of Amelia Bosch/Shav Villegas won the Class A-4A Doubles title after beating Gabriela Fulgenzi/Mariana Armijo of Robertson 6-2, 6-4. The Los Alamos team of Aditya Viswanathan/Michael Witkowski won the Class A-4A Boys Doubles Title beating Jackson Friedland/Noah Friedland of Santa Fe Prep 3-6, 6-4, 6-4.
