



# 2025 Blue Cross & Blue Shield of New Mexico State 4A-5A Track & Field Championships

## Albuquerque Academy Is Back On Top

For the first time since 2019, Albuquerque Academy won the Boys Class 4A Title at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Academy finished first with 74.5 points, three-and-a-half points ahead of second place Artesia. St. Pius X was third with 65 points. Academy's Nicholas Ponte won the 1,600m run (4:24.38) and 3,200m run (9:25.97). The Chargers won the 1,600m sprint medley (3:36.10) and 4x800m relay (8:10.16). Academy junior Elliot Hickey won the 800m run (1:58.60).



Bloomfield junior Andrew Himes won the 110m hurdles (14.84) and triple jump (43'1"). Hope Christian senior Breylon Williams won the 300m hurdles (38.58). Lovington junior Alex Rivera won the discus (148'10"). St. Pius X won the 4x100m relay (41.66) and 4x400m relay (3:23.70). St. Pius X sophomore Hershul Olloway won the 100m dash (10.96). St. Pius senior Bryan Thomas finished first in the 400m dash (47.82) and 200m dash (22.19). Thomas was the high-point individual with 21.5 points.

Artesia won the 4x200m relay (1:28.40). Artesia's Bryce Parra won the long jump (22'1.5") and his teammate Marco Soto won the shot put (52'2.75"). Aztec freshman Jake Roberts won the pole vault (13'6"). Goddard sophomore Jose Porras won the high jump (6'4"). Portales senior Manny Chavez shattered the javelin state record with a final throw of 211'10".

## Los Alamos Girls Win Their 5th Straight

For the 5th consecutive year, Los Alamos High School won the Girls Class 4A Title at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Los Alamos finished first with 111 points. Albuquerque Academy was second with 102



and Moriarty was third with 53 points. Los Alamos won the 4x200m relay (1:42.76) and 4x400m relay (4:02.47). Los Alamos senior Colette Bibeault won the 300m hurdles (44.37) and set a state mark in the pole vault at 11'7".

Albuquerque Academy Grace Erinle was the high point individual scoring 30.5 points for the Chargers. The sophomore set a new state record in the 100m dash with a time of 12 seconds-flat and she won the 200m dash (25.21). Erinle also won the triple jump (38'3.5") and long jump (18'11.5"). Academy sophomore Anna Hastings won the 1,600m run (5:00.6). Albuquerque Academy won the 4x100m relay in record time (47.63) and the Chargers won the 1,600m sprint medley (4:15.46). Belen sophomore Sophia Cox won the 400m dash (57.01). Artesia's Hattie Harrison set a new state mark in the 100m hurdles (14.77) and her teammate Brooklynne Ivans won the shot put (36'6.25"). Moriarty sophomore Carmen Dorsey-Spitz won the 3,200m run (10:36.68) and her teammate Presley Edwards won the javelin (128'4"). Grants junior Laila Martinez set a new state record in the 800m run with a time of 2:13.65. Highland junior Rebecca Neal won the high jump (5'2"). Pojoaque senior Mikayla Calabaza won the discus (121'7"). Belen won the 4x800m relay (9:57.50).

### **Cleveland Storm Make It 9 In a Row**

For the 9th consecutive time, Cleveland High School claimed the Boys Class 5A Title at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. The Storm finished first with 73 points. Organ Mountain was second with 64 points and La Cueva was third with 60. Cleveland won the 4x200m relay (1:27.54) and Cleveland junior Moses Sparks finished first in the shot put (53'11.25").

La Cueva's Tanner Montano had a memorable two-days of competition. The junior won the 100m dash (10.77) and tied the long-standing state record in the long jump with a leap of 24'3.25". Montano was the high-point individual with 22 points. His teammate Grant Vlaun shattered the state pole vault record by going up and over 16'6". Organ Mountain distance runner Corbin Coombs finished his high school career with 21 overall points and more hardware. The senior won the 1,600m run (4:13.76), set a state record in the 800m run with a time of 1:50.33. He also broke the state mark in the 3,200m run with his time of 8:50.22.



Organ Mountain also won the 1,600m sprint medley (3:32.43) and Organ Mountain senior Ryan Harrington finished first in the 200m dash (22.03). Santa Fe set a new record in the 4x100m relay with a time of 41.31 seconds, and they broke the state mark in the 4x400m relay after clocking a time of 3:15.34. Santa Fe senior Valin Wittenburg broke the state record in the 400m dash with a time of 46.42 seconds and his teammate Cody Clovis won the 110m hurdles (15.32). Farmington senior Alex Serrano won the 300m hurdles (38.52). Jonah Moyers of Carlsbad claimed top honors in the high jump (6'6"). Centennial junior Luke Matherly won the discus (149'7"). Clovis senior Ihab Mesbah won the triple jump (46'2.25"). Brennan Nelson of Volcano Vista took first in the javelin (172'10"). Hobbs finished first in the 4x800m relay (7:57.02).



### It's Back-To-Back Wins For Rio Rancho

For the 2nd straight year Rio Rancho High School finished on top of the Girls Class 5A standings at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Rio Rancho finished first with 56 points, four points better than second place Eldorado. La Cueva was third with 46 points. The Rams won the 1,600m sprint medley (4:15.09).

Las Cruces senior Kaselle Davis was a multi-event winner and high point individual for the second straight year. Davis racked up 26 points with wins in the in the 400m dash (556.07), 200m dash (25.37), and high jump (5'6"). Eldorado freshman Giana Rahmer dominated the distance runs once again. She shattered the state record in the 3,200m run with a time of 10:33, and she came up just short of her own record in winning the 1,600m run (4:55.17). Eldorado set a state record in the 4x800m relay with a time of 9:38.17.

Morgan James of Cleveland won the 100m hurdles (14.91) and 300m hurdles (44.39). Hobbs senior Faith Vine is the 100m dash state champion (12.28) and her teammate Zayla Mitchell won the long jump (18'4"). Adelyn Harper of Albuquerque High won the 800m run (2:17.81). Centennial senior Anniston Lustig won the shot put (40'0.25"). Sofia Herrea of Las Cruces won the javelin (132'6"). Kaili Roosild of Eldorado won the pole vault (11'). Rio Grande senior Isabella Files won the discus (124'8"). Farmington freshman Avery Sandefer won the triple jump (35'8"). Sandia won the 4x100m relay in a record time of 47.83 seconds and finished first in the 4x200m relay (1:42.50). The Matadors also won the 4x400m relay (4:01.64).
