The St. Michael's Streak Continues In 2025

St. Michael's ended another season on top winning the Boys Class 3A Title at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. St. Michael's finished first with 93 points, 38.5 points better than second place New Mexico Military Institute. Santa Fe Prep was third with 53 points. St. Michael's has won every Class 3A title since 2019. St. Michael's senior Soren Annon had an impressive final high school state meet, winning the 110m hurdles (14.87) and 300m hurdles (38.60), along with the 200m dash (22.16). Annon also ran the opening leg in their winning 4x400m relay (3:29.83). He was the high point individual with 23.5 points



overall. St. Michael's also won the 1,600m sprint medley (3:40.67).

Ruidoso set the state record in the 4x800m relay with a winning time of 8:20.29. Santa Fe Prep took first in the 4x200m relay (1:32.40). New Mexico Military Institute won the 4x100m relay (44.08) and NMMI senior Cohen Tomasitas won the 100m dash (10.99). NMMI sophomore Miguel Garcia took first in the 400m dash (50.83). Navajo Prep's Elijah England finished first in the 1,600m run (4:28.44) and 3,200m run (9:56.98). Shane Yara of Cottonwood Classical won the 800m run (1:58.30). West Las Vegas

senior Mark Balizan won the high jump (6'2") and triple jump (42'). Ruidoso junior Jairdan Pederson won the pole vault (11'6"). Cuba junior Richard Lovato won the discus (143'2") and shot put (45'2.5"). Santa Fe Indian School junior Corey Bird won the long jump (21'6.5"). Tularosa senior Seth Kazhe won the javelin (155'1").

St. Michael's Claims 3A Title For 5th Consecutive Year

For the 5th year in a row, St. Michael's finished the season on top. St. Michael's won the Girls Class 3A Title at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue



Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. St. Michael's wrapped up the two-day event with 84.5 points. Santa Fe Prep was second with 81.5 and Sandia Prep was third with 72.

St. Michael's won the 4x200m relay (1:47.86) and 1,600m sprint medley in a record time of 4:18.83. They also won the 4x400m relay (4:07.45). St. Michael's sophomore Nadia Cedillo won the javelin (114'9"). Santa Fe Prep girls set the state mark in the 4x800m relay with a winning time of 9:54.58. Santa Fe Prep also won the 4x100m relay (50.56) and Lucia Reyes Newell of Santa Fe Prep won the pole vault (9'3"). Dahlia Reyes Newell of Santa Fe Prep won the triple jump (35'1.25").


Sandia Prep senior Kate Henderson won the 3,200m run (11:33.39), crossed the finish line first in the 1,600m run (5:18.87), and won the 800m run (2:18.42). Her teammate Lexie Dixon was a multi-event winner in the 100m dash (12.68), 400m dash (58.05), and set the new state mark in the 200m dash with a time of 25.77. Dixon was the high point individual with 23 points overall. Dexter senior Alexa Miramontes won the 100m hurdles (15.53) and her senior classmate Nalani Cobos won the 300m hurdles (46.58). Chastity Saintjuste of West Las Vegas finished first in the long jump (17'5.75"). Santa Fe Indian School senior Emma Lewis won the shot put (32'6"). Her teammate Kaydence Riley won the high jump (5'2"). Alex Gonzales of Hot Springs claimed victory in the discus (102'10").

Texico Boys Take Their First State Title Since 2013

Texico High School ended the season on top winning the Boys Class 2A Title at the 2025 Blue Cross and

Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Texico finished first with 60.5 points. Legacy Academy was second with 50 and Hagerman was third with 46.5 points. It's Texico first team title since 2013. Texico won the 4x100m relay (44.43) and Texico senior Taye Smith was a repeat winner in the show put (47'10").

Mesa Vista set the new state mark in the 4x800m relay with a winning time of 8:26.57, lowering the mark by more than 23 seconds. Menaul junior J'Quan Samuels won the high jump by clearing 6'6". Legacy Academy senior Noah Sanchez won the discus (139'). His



teammate Jay Lee won both the 110m hurdles (15.59) and 300m hurdles (40.73), along with the 200m dash (22.55) and pole vault (14'). Lee was the high point individual of the meet with 33 points. Hagerman senior Jevon Aguilar won the 100m dash (11.07) and long jump (21'10.5"). Rider Gonzales of Loving won the 400m dash (51.07). Dulce senior Jaren Johnson won the triple jump (41'11.5"). Laguna Acoma junior Tagoya Pedro was the long-distance champ for the second straight year, winning the 1,600m run in a record time of 4:27.45, and the 3,200m run in a time of 9:43.09. He also claimed victory in the 800m run with a state record time of 1:54.79. His teammate Derek Victorino won the javelin (160'9"). Eunice won the 4x200m relay (1:32.72) and 4x400m relay (3:31.61). Pecos set the record in the 1,600m sprint medley with a time of 3:40.42.

Texico Girls Take The 2A Title For The Wolverines Sweep

The Girls Class 2A team trophy went to the same school that claimed the Boys State Championship. Texico won the Girls 2A Title at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Texico finished first with 66 points. Legacy Academy was second with 58.5 and Tucumcari was third with 51 points. It's Texico's first state title since 2009. Texico eighth grader Emery Parr won the pole vault (10') and the Texico girls won the 4x400m relay (4:18.54).



Oak Grove Classical Academy freshman Olivia Marquez was the high point individual with 21 points over the two days. She is a back-to-back state champ in the 3,200m run, winning in a time of 12:07.26; and she won the 1,600m run (5:27.85), and 800m run (2:25.42). Legacy Academy junior Sonrisa Gonzales won both the 100m hurdles (16.56) and 300m hurdles (48.41), while her teammate Taliyah Martinez finished first in the 400m dash (59.37). Rehoboth Christian junior Katie Garoutte finished first in the 100m dash (12.37) and 200m dash (25.53). Her freshman teammate Ellen Zwiers won the high jump (5'). Capitan sophomore Faith Thomas won the long jump (16'5"). Tucumcari won the 4x100m relay (51.91) and 4x200m relay (1:50.84). Tucumcari freshman Shantel Lopez won the shot put (32'4.5") and discus (105'1"). Estancia junior Jhenna Valencia finished first in the javelin (134'3"). Alyse Lovato of Question won the triple jump (34'7.25"). Jal won the 1,600m sprint medley (4:37.45) and McCurdy won the 4x800m relay (10:51.71).

Logan Boys Dominate The Field In 2025

There was a clear winner in Boys Class A at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Logan won the team title with an eye-popping 126 points, 73 points better than second place Fort Sumner. Cimarron was third with 47 points. It's the third straight state team title for Logan. It was the Haden Judd show for two days on the track as the high point individual who racked up 35 points for his team. The Logan senior not only won five different events, but also broke records in multiple events as well. The senior speedster won the 100m dash in a record time of 10.87, the 200m dash in a record time of 22.62, and set a new state record in the pole vault at 15'6". Haden also won the triple jump (41'7.5") and became a five-time champ in the 300m hurdles (40.30). Logan's Aydin

Kotara was the first to cross the finish line in the 400m dash (51.51). Devin Kotara of Logan won the 800m run (2:05.56) and his teammate Mason Wallin won the shot put (49'0.25"). Logan set the state record in the 4x800m relay with a time of 8:45.33. The Logan boys also won the 4x100m relay (45.63) and 4x400m relay (3:41.55).

Melrose senior Landen Flores won the 110m hurdles (15.59) and his teammate Ayden Clavel set the state record in the javelin with a toss of 172'3". Aaron Torres of Fort Sumner



broke his own state record in the discus with a throw of 141'1". Fort Sumner took first in the 4x200m relay (1:36.20). Melrose is the champ in the 1,600m sprint medley with a new record of 3:52.75. Bryson Shock, a freshman from Cliff, took first in the 1,600m run (4:49.12). His senior teammate Tayson Yost won the long jump (20'0.75"). Wheeler Leach of Cimarron was the fastest in the 3,200m run (10:34.07). Grady sophomore Rawley Bone won the high jump (6'4").

Fort Sumner Girls Edge Out Logan For The Team Title

Every point mattered in the Girls Class A 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Fort Sumner took home the team title with 91 points, one point better than second place Logan. Melrose was third with 62 points.

Fort Sumner senior Alyssa Casaus set the state mark in the long jump by going 17'6" and won the triple jump (33'9"). Fort Sumner won the 4x800m relay (10:59.66). Fort Sumner freshman Lacey McCollum was the first to cross the finish line in the 3,200m run (12:36.84), the 1,600m run (5:45.81), and she also won the 800m run (2:32.33).

Logan sophomore Makinlee Judd put together a record setting performance weekend, setting the record in the pole vault by going over 9'6", winning the 100m hurdles in record time (15.88), and finishing first in the 100m dash (12.89). Judd also ran the second leg on Logan's winning team in the 4x200m relay (1:51.68). Judd was the high point individual with 25.5 points on the meet. Her teammate Abby Paris won

the discus (99'1"). Logan finished first in the 1,600m sprint medley (4:47.49).

Mountainair junior Gabriella Knoten won the 400m dash (1:00.58) and 200m dash with a record time of 26.78. Gateway Christian junior Alani Magill won the 300m hurdles, beating her own record in a time of 47.39. Elida sophomore Reatta Munsell won the shot put (34'5.5"). Des Moines freshman Katy Ward won the high jump (5'). Melrose junior Hally Draper finished first in the javelin (110'7"). Melrose set a new state mark in the 4x400m relay with a winning time of 4:20.66. Dora is the 4x100m relay winner (52.04)
