# 2026 Blue Cross & Blue Shield of New Mexico State 1A-3A Track & Field Championships

## Girls Class A

Logan High School claimed the top honor for the Class A Girls Team Title at the 2026 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Logan finished first with 95.5 points. Fort Sumner was second with 76 and Gateway Christian was third with 66. Dora's Karen Inge was the high point individual with 26.5 points, winning the 100m dash, 200m dash (26.17-state record) and 400m dash (59.90-state record). First place Logan got several points from junior Makinlee Judd who won the 100m hurdles and pole vault.

Other individual winners include: Gateway Christian's Alani Magill in the 300m hurdles, Lacey McCollum of Fort Sumner in the 3200m run and 1600m run, Fort Sumner eighth grader Savanna Segura in the 800m run, Quemado's Nekishia Garcia in the long jump and high jump, Elida's Reatta Munsell in the shot put, Clayton Boyd of Fort Sumner in the discus, Logan's Sarah Williams in the triple jump, and Hally Draper of Melrose in the javelin.

Dora won the 4x100m relay and Logan finished first in the 4x200m relay with a record time of 1:49.65. Melrose set a new record in the 1600m sprint medley (4:32.39). Logan set a new state record mark in the 4x400m relay (4:17.61). Fort Sumner won the 4x800m relay in a record time of 10:42.04.



## Boys Class A

Melrose High School was the top boys team in Class A at the 2026 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Melrose finished first with 83 points. Logan was second with 80 and Mountainair was third with 47. Kanaan Stephens of Magdalena was the high point individual with 21.5 points, winning the pole vault.

Other individual winners include: Magdalena's Ky Stephens in the 110m hurdles, Santiago Lopez of New Mexico School for the Deaf in the 100m dash and 200m dash, Taysen Begay



of Tse Yi Gai in the 1600m run and 3200m run, Logan's Aydin Kotara in the 400m dash, Jaxon Odom of Melrose in the 300m hurdles, Melrose freshman Zamien Saucedo in the 800m run, Mountainair's Elijah Kayser in the high jump, Aaron Torres of Fort Sumner in the discus (174'11"-state record), Zachary Schaffer of Logan in the triple jump, Corey Terrell of Animas in the long jump, Hays Rush of Grady in the javelin, and Mason Wallin of Logan in the shot put (52'9.75"-state record).

Mountainair won the 4x100m relay in a record time of 44.71 and the 4x200m relay in with a new record of 1:33.21. Melrose set a new state mark in the 1600m sprint medley (3:47.07) and 4x800m relay (8:39.26). Logan set a new state record in the 4x400m relay (3:33.84).

## Girls Class 2A

Legacy Academy was on top of the podium for the Class 2A Girls Team Title at the 2026 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Legacy Academy finished first with 81 points. Texico was second with 64 and Capitan was third with 39. Legacy Academy standout Taliyah Martinez was the high point individual with 23.5 points, winning the 100m dash in a record time of 12.18. She now holds the record in that event in both Class A and 2A. Martinez also won the 200m dash and 400m dash. Her teammate Sonrisa Gonzales won the 100m hurdles and 300m hurdles.

Other individual winners include: Maria Roybal of Pecos in the 3200m run, 8th grader Cambrie Gonzales of Penasco in the 1600m run, Rylee Edaakie of Native American Community Academy in the 800m run, Jal's Natalia Rivera in the long jump, Jacqueline Boyd of Eunice in the shot put and discus, Cassia Moore of Cloudcroft in the triple jump, Jhenna Valencia of Estancia in the javelin, Texico's Emery Parr in the pole vault, and Ellen Zwiers of Rehoboth Christian in the high jump.

Legacy Academy won the 4x100m relay in a record time of 49.38. Rehoboth Christian won the 4x200m relay. Native American Community Academy won the 1600m sprint medley. Texico finished first in the 4x400m relay and set a new state record in the 4x800m relay (10:35.48).

## Boys Class 2A

For the first time since 1992, Menaul School was the top boys team in Class 2A at the 2026 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. Menaul finished first with 75.5 points. Pecos was second with 55 points and Legacy Academy was third with 45.5. Legacy Academy senior Jay Lee was the high point individual with an impressive 32 points, winning the 100m dash, 300m hurdles, 200m dash in a record time of 21.93, and finishing first in the pole vault.

Other individual winners include: Santa Rosa's LeeAllen Lujan in the 110m hurdles, re-



turning state champ Pedro Tagoya in the 800m run and 1600m run, Rider Gonzales in the 400m dash, Brandyn Encinias of Pecos in the 3200m run, J'Quan Sameuls of Menaul in the high jump (6'9.25"-state record) and long jump, Tatum's Anthony Montez in the triple jump, Legacy Academy's Luke Sanchez in the shot put, Santa Rosa's Lachlan Ross in the javelin, and Felix Chacon of Hagerman in the discus. Texico won the 4x100m relay and Pecos set a new record in the 4x200m relay (1:31.42). Pecos set a new state mark in the 1600m sprint medley (3:35.04) and set a record in the 4x400m relay (3:29.27). Mesa Vista set the new state mark in the 4x800m relay with a time of 8:22.17.

### Girls Class 3A

For the 6th year in a row, St. Michael's earned more points than any other program to win the Class 3A Girls Team Title at the 2026 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. St. Michael's finished first with 108 points. Santa Fe Prep was second with 100 and Cottonwood Classical was third with 54. Jaylyn Olguin from East Mountain was the high point individual with 24.5 points, winning the 100m dash.

Other individual winners include: Santa Fe Prep's Marley Belyeu in the 100m hurdles and long jump, Sophia Miera in the 400m dash, Charlotte Herman of St. Michael's in the 300m hurdles, Gigi Cole of St. Michael's in the 200m dash, Santa Fe Prep's Sophie Bair in the 1600m run and 3200m run, Santa Fe Indian School's Kaydence Riley in the 800m run and high jump, Nadia Sedillo of St. Michael's in the javelin, Tularosa's Alivya Young in the discus, Santa Fe Prep's Lucia Reyes Newell in the pole vault, West Las Vegas freshman Kesheawna in the triple jump, and Devynne Jenkins of Robertson in the shot put.

Santa Fe Prep won the 4x100m relay, 4x800m relay, and set a record in the 1600m sprint medley (4:18.00). East Mountain finished first in the 4x200m relay with a record time of 1:44.68. St. Michael's won the 4x400m relay.



### Boys Class 3A

St. Michael's dominated the Boys Class 3A competition at the 2026 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico NMAA State Track and Field Championships. St. Michael's finished first with 87.5 points. Navajo Prep was second with 66 and Sandia Prep was third with 59.

It's the seventh straight state title for the Horsemen. Kamal Stith of St. Michael's was the high point individual with 25 points, winning the 110m hurdles and 300m hurdles, along with finishing first in the long jump.

Other individual winners include: Sandia Prep's Wyatt Abruzzo in the 100m dash, state cross country champion Elijah England of Navajo Prep in the 1600m run, 3200m run, and 800m run (1:53.52-state record), Henry Van Bibber from Academy for Technology and the Classics in the 400m dash, Santa Fe Indian School's Corey Bird in the 200m dash, Cobre's



Zavin Guck in the high jump, Ruidoso's Jerimy Williams in the pole vault, Santa Fe Prep' freshman Faith Rosen in the triple jump, Hector Ramirez of Dexter in the javelin, and Cuba's Richard Lovato in the discus and shot put.

Sandia Prep won the 4x100m relay and set a new record in the 4x200m relay (1:31.32). St. Michael's won the 1600m sprint medley. Santa Fe Indian School finished first in the 4x400m relay. Navajo Prep set a new state record in the 4x800m relay with a time of 8:14.66, more than 5 seconds faster than the previous mark.
