



# 2026 New Mexico Army National Guard State Wrestling Championships



## Class 5A

At the 2026 New Mexico Army National Guard State Wrestling Championships, Cleveland High School didn't just win — they overwhelmed. The Storm crowned themselves Class 5A team champions with a thunderous 317-point performance, finally reclaiming the top spot for the first time since 2017. Three-time defending champion Volcano Vista High School fought hard, but settled for second with 283.5 points. Las Cruces High School finished a proud third at 151.5.



Thirteen Storm wrestlers marched into the finals, and four left with gold: Ricardo Poolaw (113), Roman Luttrell (120), Reagan Luttrell (165), and Riley Haussler (285). And Roman Luttrell didn't just win — he made history. With his fifth state title, Luttrell joined the rare five-time champions club and slamming the door on his high school career with a flawless 50-0 senior season.

Other individual champions included Jaxon Moralez (106) and Josiah Neri (126) of Rio Rancho High School, three time winner Diego Torrez (132) of Cibola High School, three-time winners Lorenzo Gallegos (138) and Jonathon Romero (144), plus Ben Duran (150) and Akeem Mitchell (190), and Elijah Gawronski (215) of Volcano Vista, Kolby Gonzales (157) of Las Cruces, and Samuel Pages (175) of Hobbs High School.

## Class 4A

At the 2026 New Mexico Army National Guard State Wrestling Championships, Aztec High School proved their reign was no one-year wonder. The Tigers defended their Class 4A crown in commanding fashion, piling up 241 points to stand alone at the top for the second straight season. Behind them, Belen High School made a strong push for second with 156 points, while West Las Vegas High School wasn't far behind in third with 153. As a team, Aztec placed six wrestlers in the final with



five of them finishing first: Ethan Vigil (120), James Moore (126), Taner Olguin (132), Cory Douglas (165), and Aiden Trujillo (215).

Other individual winners include: Dominik Suarez of Valencia High School (106), West Las Vegas High School wrestlers Andres Ram Lopez (113), Korbyn Harvey (175) and Vicente Garcia (190) who finished his season with a perfect record of 46-0, Gage Sellers of Miyamura High School (138), Mycah Gachupin (144) and undefeated senior (48-0) Valentine Popadiuc (157) of St Pius X High School, Kellan Ray of Bloomfield High School (150), and Isaac Ledezma of Deming High School (285).

## Girls

For the third year in a row, the Cleveland Storm finished the wrestling season on top. V. Sue Cleveland High School won the 2026 New Mexico Army National Guard State Wrestling Championships with 146 points. Las Cruces High School was second with 114.5 points and Miyamura High School third with 110.

Individually, Cleveland had four state champions: Kaydence O'Neil- Dreher (100), Miranda Stewart (120), Heaven Guevara (135), and Eloise Woolsey (145). Woolsey won all four of her matches by pin in the first period to win her second

state title in New Mexico (fourth overall with two in Hawaii). Sandia's Jaden Meadows (170) also won her fourth straight state title and capped off her senior season with a perfect undefeated record of 40-0.

Other winners include: Alexis Avis-Labus of Valencia High School (105), Albuquerque Academy's Vivienne Popadiuc (110), Autiana Caro of Las Cruces (115), Alexis Morales of Miyamura (125), Volcano Vista's Sophia Rimbart (130), Laura Almanza of Deming High School (140), Sandia High School's Neviah Varela-Marquez (145) and Kassandra Arundale-Walton (190), and Caylee Miller of Bloomfield High School (235).
