Adjudicators' Biographies



Dr. Martin Behnke (Oregon) – Following several years of teaching music in the California public schools and in colleges and universities in four other states, Dr. Martin Behnke went to Willamette University in 1979 as Director of University Bands, later serving as Chairman of the Department of Music as well. In addition to his teaching background and 12 years as a professional trombonist, Dr. Behnke has maintained involvement throughout his career as a jazz pianist and composer. In 1985, he received an Oregon Arts Commission Individual Artist Fellowship to study composition with Norman Dello Joio. In 1999, he received an Oregon Council for the Humanities Research Grant to present the life and music of Duke Ellington for the Smithsonian's traveling exhibit, "Beyond Category." Dr. Behnke has received commissions for his instrumental and choral compositions and his music is published by Columbia Pictures Publications, Alfred Music, UNC Jazz Press, and his own *Timberline Music Company*. Following his retirement from Willamette University in 2005, Dr. Behnke relocated to Southern Oregon, where he directed the jazz ensembles and taught applied jazz piano and improvisation at Southern Oregon University. He remains active as a composer, conductor, adjudicator, clinician, jazz pianist and lecturer.



Diane Koutsulis (Nevada) – Diane Koutsulis is the Director of Bands and Arts Department Chair at Green Valley High School. Originally from Chicago, Diane has been teaching in the Clark County School District for the past 35 years. She received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Music from Western Illinois University. After teaching junior high band in Oswego, Illinois, for three years, she went on to complete the Masters of Music Education degree at Louisiana State University, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where she studied with Frank Wickes. During her tenure in Las Vegas, Diane has built fine band programs and music departments at both Las Vegas High School (1982-91) and Green Valley High School (1991-present). Her groups have consistently garnered recognition for fine performances and she has served as both guest clinician and conductor at various conferences and honor bands throughout the United States. Diane was named the 1999 Nevada Teacher of the Year and received the 1999 Milken Family Foundation National Educator Award. A member of the Clark County School District Teacher Hall of Fame, in March of 2003, she was inducted into the Nevada State Education Hall of Fame. In 2004, the Green Valley High School Symphonic Band performed at the Midwest Clinic in Chicago, IL. In 2005 and 2010, the Symphonic Band performed at Carnegie Hall in New York City. The Green Valley HS Marching Band performed in the 2010 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City, as well as the 2009 and 1993 Presidential Inaugural Parades. Diane is a member of the National Band Association (NBA) as well as holding memberships in Nevada Music Educators Association (NMEA), National Association for Music Education (NAfME), and College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA). Diane is honored to be a member of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association (ABA).



Luis "Chico" Portillo (Texas) – Mr. Chico Portillo currently serves as the Director of Fine Arts for the Bastrop Independent School District. Prior to that appointment, he served eight years as the Coordinator of Fine Arts for the Pflugerville Independent School District. He is an active adjudicator and clinician and provides many professional development opportunities for school districts and universities across the state. He has also served on numerous UIL and TMEA music committees. During his 21 years of classroom teaching, the students in his bands consistently maintained a high level of excellence as they received numerous UIL Sweepstakes and "Best in Class" awards for both marching and concert band performances. Under his leadership, the John B. Connally High School Marching Band earned the bronze medal in 2003 and the silver medal in 2007 in the biannual UIL 4A State Marching Contest. The Connally Wind Ensemble was twice a state finalist in the 4A TMEA Honor Band Competition. Mr. Portillo is a member of the Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Music Administrators Conference, Texas Music Adjudicators Association and the honorary band fraternity Phi Beta Mu. He is currently on the Board of Directors of the Texas Bandmasters Association serving as the President Elect. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Texas at Austin and a Masters of Education degree from Concordia University.

CONCERT ETIQUETTE

Members of the audience, as well as the musicians, are participants in every concert. When you participate in listening to the music, you will be playing an important part by sharing this experience with others in the, audience and with the musicians on stage. In order to make a concert enjoyable for everyone, here are some tips to remember:

- Enter the auditorium quietly. Once you have been seated, be alert to activity on the stage as the musicians take their place for the concert.
- Turn all cell phones and pagers off when you enter the auditorium. Refrain from texting as it can be distracting to those around you trying to enjoy the performance.
- When the conductor enters, it is customary to applaud politely. Whistling, yelling, or screaming is not appropriate at any time before, during, or after a concert.
- Never stand or move around while music is being performed. It distracts listeners around you, as well as the performers. If you must leave for any reason, wait until a piece is finished and the audience is applauding. Also, return to your seat only between numbers.
- It is impolite to talk, or even whisper, while the music is being performed. Listeners and performers are also distracted by sounds from programs, candy wrappers, jewelry and other objects. Remain still, and be thoughtful of others by talking or making sounds only between numbers.
- Watch the conductor when the music stops to decide whether or not to applaud. Some musical works have several parts or movements and the audience is expected to applaud only after all movements have been performed.

No flash photography will be allowed during the contest as it can be distracting to the musicians. Thank you.
