



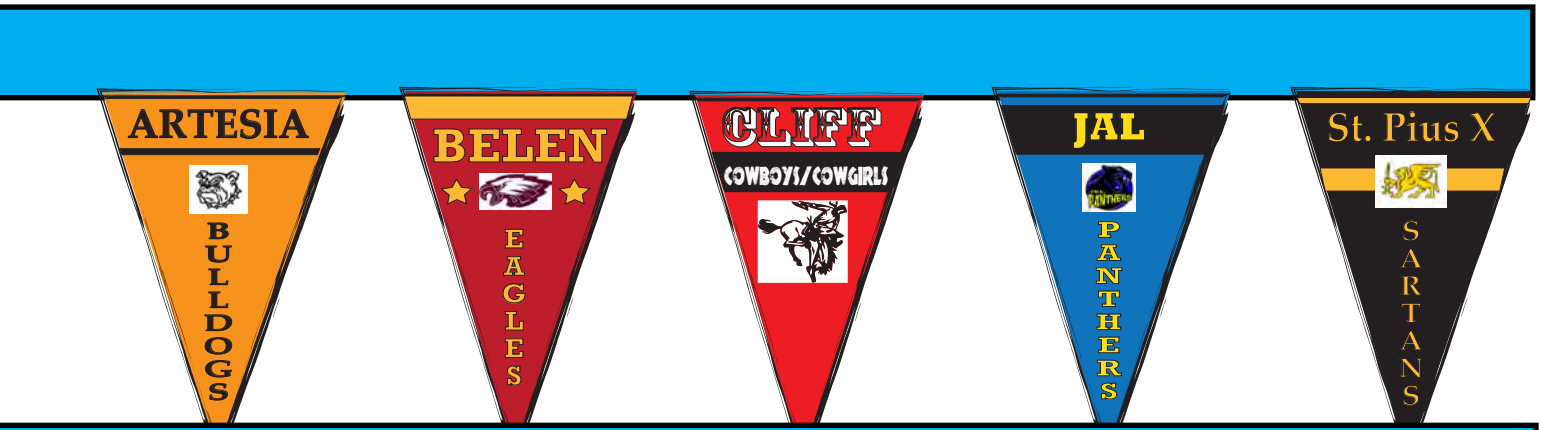
# NEW MEXICO ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION FOUNDATION 2015-2016 ANNUAL REPORT

**\$2,500-\$4,999**

## PLATINUM

**\$5,000-\$9,999**

Same as above, plus ten fun run entries, one team in bowl-a-thon, and one team in golf tournament.

## DIAMOND

**\$10,000 and above**

Same as above, plus ten additional fun run entries, one additional team in bowl-a-thon, and one additional team in golf tournament.

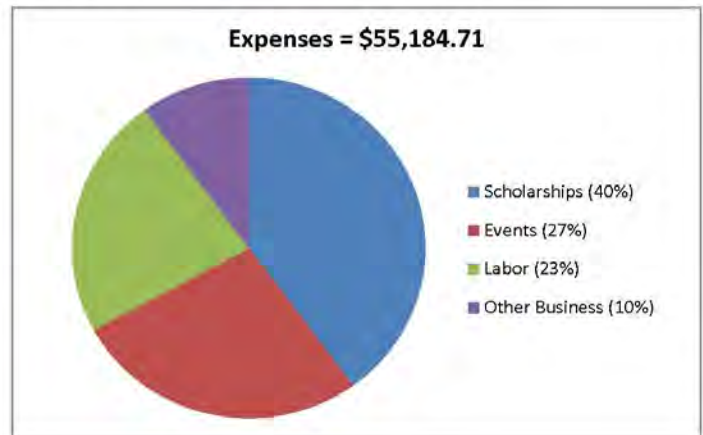
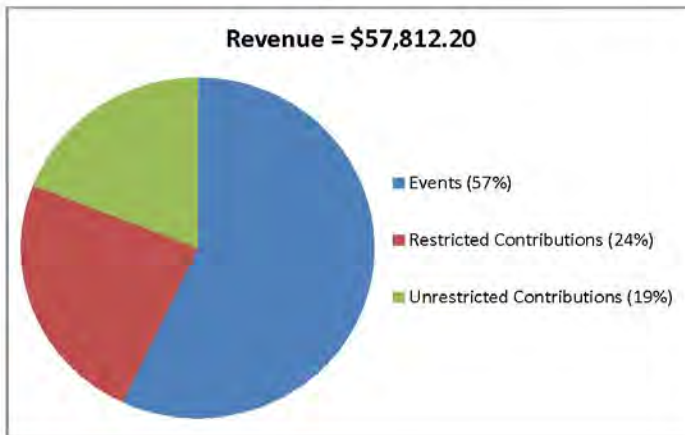
