# NEW MEXICO ATHLETIC DIRECTORS ASSOCIATION

# CONSTITUTION

# **ARTICLE I - NAME**

The name of this organization shall be the New Mexico Athletic Directors Association.

# **ARTICLE II - PURPOSE**

The purpose of this organization shall be:

- 1. To preserve, nurture and perpetuate interscholastic athletics and its educational aspects in perspective to the integrity of the total curriculum.
- 2. To improve athletic understanding and relationships throughout the State of New Mexico.
- **3**. To establish unity and fellowship among all members.
- 4. To promote uniformity in athletic policies throughout the State of New Mexico.
- 5. To cooperate with the administrative head while remaining cognizant that he/she is held ultimately responsible in all matters related to interscholastic activities involving his/her school.
- 6. To establish closer working relationships with related professional groups.
- 7. To assist and cooperate with the New Mexico High School Coaches Association, the New Mexico High School Officials Association, and the New Mexico Activities Association in maintaining their goals and objectives.
- 8. To promote the professional growth and image of interscholastic athletic administrators.

# **ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP**

#### Section 1 - Active Membership

The Association shall be limited to all athletic directors and all others who have athletic administrative responsibilities in the State of New Mexico.

#### Section 2 - Associate Membership

Associate membership shall be open to other interested parties, such as school administrators, retired athletic directors, university students in the field of sport administration, and others as approved by the NMADA Board.

#### Section 3 - Dues

The NMADA Board of Directors establishes membership classifications and dues annually.

#### Section 4 - Voting Privilege

All current paid Association members present at the meeting are eligible to cast a vote.

#### Section 5 - Association Year

The Association year shall begin July 1 and end June 30.

# **ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS**

#### Section 1 - Officers

The officers shall be the Past President, President, Vice-President, and Secretary-Treasurer and shall serve 1 year terms.

#### Section 2 - Duties of the President

The President shall preside at all meetings of the NMADA as the Chief Executive Officer. The president shall also preside at all meetings of the NMADA Board of Directors. The president shall have the power to appoint special committees for the purpose of improving the objectives of the Association. The president shall serve as the NMADA representative on the NMAA Commission.

## Section 3 - Duties of the Vice President

The vice president shall assume the duties of the president in his/her absence or in his/her inability to act. He/she shall assist the president in any matters necessary. The vice president shall be the president-elect and automatically move into the presidency. The vice president shall serve as the NMADA/NIAAA Awards Chairperson and NMADA representative on the New Mexico High School Coaches Association Board of Directors.

#### Section 4 – Secretary-Treasurer

The secretary-treasurer shall be the chief corresponding officer responsible for all such records and proceedings of the NMADA. The secretary-treasurer shall be responsible for notices, publications, reports and other items necessary for proper operation of the NMADA. The secretary-treasurer shall have primary responsibility for membership development, records, etc. The secretary-treasurers shall give a financial report as a routine order of business at all meetings of the NMADA.

# Section 5 – Past President

The past president shall consult, advise, and assist the officers in the leadership functions of the NMADA. The past president shall conduct meetings in the absence of the president and the vice president.

# **ARTICLE V – BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

#### Section 1 - Officers

All elected officers of the NMADA serve on the board of directors.

#### Section 2 – Classification Representatives

Classification (A/2A/3A and 4A/5A) representatives (one north, one south for each combined two classifications) are appointed by the president and serve two year staggered terms on the board of directors. These representatives shall be "active" rather than "retired."

#### Section 3 – Additional members

The New Mexico NIAAA Coordinator (LTC/Liaison/Testing Coordinator), NMADA Webmaster, Middle School and Retired Representatives (appointed by the President for a term of 2 years, staggered), and the NMADA Executive Director shall serve on the Board of Directors.

#### Section 4 - Quorum

A quorum shall consist of two-thirds of the membership of the Board of Directors and any action taken will be based on simple majority vote.

# **ARTICLE VI - MEETINGS**

#### Section 1 - NMADA Meetings

The NMADA shall have three meetings each year. Generally, they shall be held during the New Mexico High School Coaches Association Clinic, the NMADA annual conference, and the NMAA State Basketball Tournament. Meetings may be scheduled at other times at the discretion of the president.

#### Section 2 – Board of Directors Meetings

The Board of Directors shall meet as often as deemed necessary to administer their business. Meetings shall be called by the president. Notice of at least one week should be given to all members as to the time, place and agenda.

# **ARTICLE VII - ELECTIONS AND APPOINTMENTS**

Section 1 - Election of Officers

Election of officers shall be at the conclusion session of the July meeting.

#### Section 2 - New Officers

All newly elected officers shall take office at the meeting of the Board of Directors following the July meeting. Transfer of offices or officers should be made as orderly as possible. Incoming officers should be advised of current business of that office in writing, submitted with all records on election.

#### Section 3 - Election of Officers

The president shall serve a one-year term and not be eligible for re-election. The vice president shall succeed to the office of president in order to retain organizational stability. The secretary-treasurer shall succeed the office of vice president. The secretary-treasurer will be elected by the members of the NMADA at the July meeting. Interim vacancies shall be filled by the succession order above and the nomination/election of a new secretary-treasurer.

#### Section 4 – Elections and Vacancies

The Board of Directors of the NMADA shall serve as the nominating committee for all general elections; the president shall appoint all classification and at-large representatives, including interim vacancies, as per sections 2 and 3, Article V; the board shall approve all "function" board members (e.g. LTC Coordinator, etc.).

#### Section 5 - Special Awards

Current Board Policy, as reflected by the awards section in the Policies, Operations and Procedures manual, shall be used to determine all NMADA annual and special awards.

#### **ARTICLE VIII - ORGANIZATIONAL RELATIONSHIPS**

#### Section 1 - Relationships

Group organizational relationships shall exist with all educational and administrative groups.

#### Section 2 - Correlation

The constitution and proceedings of the NMADA shall be consistent with the fundamental purpose of the New Mexico Activities Association.

#### Section 3 – Appeal process

The Board of Directors of the NMADA shall serve as the review board for all appeals.
