**Welcome** – The meeting was called to order by Mr. Ernie Viramontes at 9:03 am. A roll call was conducted by Ms. Alissa Wesbrook, NMAA Assistant to the Executive Director, and the following members were present:

14 members were present representing a quorum.

**Approval of Agenda:**

Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Mr. Henderson made a motion to approve the agenda. Mr. Roybal seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

**Approval of Minutes:**

Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the November 28, 2018 Commission Meeting as presented. Mr. Campbell made a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. Perea seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

**NMAA Directors' Report:**

Mr. Dusty Young, NMAA Associate Director, discussed (5) items on his report: 1) welcomed the two newest Commission members (Mr. Hightower & Ms. Moores); 2) provided an update on winter sports/championships (wrestling, swimming & diving, basketball, & spirit); 3) reported on the NMAA Foundation Scholarship program; 4) provided an update with regards to sportsmanship throughout the fall and winter seasons; and 5) reported on the current legislative session and the introduction of House Bill 438 (school personnel act – coaching).

**NMAA Financial Report:**

Ms. Shari Kessler-Schwamer, NMAA Business Manager, presented two (2) items on her report: 1) provided financial reports for all fall championships; and 2) presented ticket sales information for all fall championships.

**NMAA Activities Report:**

Ms. Dana Pappas, NMAA Deputy Director, presented four (4) items on her report: 1) stated that the Activities Council met in early January; 2) provided an update on the status of the NMAA's partnership with Western New Mexico University for Activities' scholarships; 3) stated that numerous activity events would take place over the next few months; and 4) provided an update on the nomination process and work of the NMAA Student Leadership Advisory Council.

**New Mexico Officials Association Report:**

Ms. Pappas presented two (2) items on her report: provided a recap of the NMOA State Baseball, Softball and Track and Field Clinics; and 2) stated that the NMOA Executive Board met in January. The Commission then asked Ms. Pappas to provide an update on officials' numbers for spring sports, which are very low at this time. Mr. Campbell also recommended that officials' fees for baseball umpires be revisited and that a possible increase to match the increase for football and basketball should be considered starting in 2019-2020.

**General Discussion/Information Items**

Tournament Fees – Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, discussed the fees that are currently being charged by schools when hosting various tournaments/meets/events during the regular season. There is a concern that these fees are starting to place a financial burden on schools across the state. The Commission recommended that this topic continue to be reviewed with possible guidelines implemented in the future. The NMAA will also discuss this item with the Board of Directors to collect more feedback.

3<sup>rd</sup> Party Filming – Ms. Marquez discussed current bylaws pertaining to the 3<sup>rd</sup> party filming of events/practices. Due to the increased use of cell phones and advances in technology, she stated that this is very hard to regulate and asked if the group felt this regulation was outdated. The Commission did feel that this bylaw may no longer be necessary and recommended that a proposal to update the regulation be brought back to the group as an action item in May.

Forfeitures / Not Competing Schedules – Ms. Marquez discussed the recent increase in forfeitures and number of schools not completing their schedules. She stated that this is having a significant negative impact on schools and kids that are ready to play a contest, but cannot due to last minute cancellations. The Commission agreed that this is an issue and recommended that strict fines, forfeitures, and possibly even decreasing games allowed for schools in future years be used as deterrents. The NMAA will also review this topic with the Board of Directors.

8<sup>th</sup> Grade Participation for Class 4A/5A – Ms. Marquez discussed 8<sup>th</sup> grade participation at the high school level, in particular for larger schools (Class 4A & 5A), and the inequities this allowance can create. The Commission discussed the item at length and agreed that this topic should continue to be reviewed with the Board of Directors and membership as a whole.

Scholastic Eligibility: 8<sup>th</sup> Graders Playing at HS Level – Ms. Marquez discussed 8<sup>th</sup> graders playing at the high school level and adding a new requirement that would ensure these individuals are in fact scholastically eligible to participate by the current marking period. The Commission supported this proposal and recommended that it be taken directly to the Board of Directors for action.

Volleyball: State Tournament Format – Ms. Marquez discussed the current State Volleyball Championship format and possible adjustments for the future. She stated that the Volleyball Sports Specific Committee supported a change that would eliminate pool play, but institute a modified double elimination format. The Commission supported this change in format and recommended that it be taken to the Board of Directors for action.

Football: One Site for State Finals – Mr. Young discussed the possibility of one site being used for all state football finals. He stated that continued discussion regarding this matter was supported by the Football Sports Specific Committee and that a slight majority of coaches were in favor of this change. The Commission provided both pros and cons regarding this topic. The NMAA will also discuss the item with the Board of Directors.

### **Action Items**

Football: State Qualifiers for 8-Man Playoffs – Mr. Young presented a proposal to consider adjusting the number of qualifiers for the 8-Man State Football playoffs from 12 to 8. This would start in the 2019-2020 school year. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Roybal made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Mirabal seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

Football: Individual Game Limitations (Referenda) – Mr. Young presented a proposal to consider adjusting Bylaw 7.15.1 D so that individuals can participate in a maximum of 11 football games during the regular season. Varsity teams would still be limited to 10 total games (sub-varsity to 9 total games; classes 8-Man & 2A-6A). Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Mabrey made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Affentranger seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

Football: Summer Activity (Referenda) – Mr. Kief Johnson, Ruidoso HS Football Coach & A.D., Mr. Charlie Dotson, Eldorado HS Football Coach, and Mr. Stewart Burnett, Estancia HS Football Coach & A.D., presented a proposal to consider adjusting NMAA Bylaws 7.5.3 and 7.15.1 B which would allow schools a 5-day period during the summer where helmets and pads can be used in a limited manner for 4 days total. The 5-day period must take place after Memorial Day and no later than Week #4 of the NMAA calendar. The first two days should be in shorts and helmets, no pads. During days three and four players should be in shorts, shoulder pads, and helmets (shells). Schools may conduct these workouts in 4 consecutive days, or may add a day of rest between days two and three. Full contact is strictly prohibited. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Mabrey made the motion to table the proposal so that more information could be collected. Mr. Perea seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the decision to table was approved (13-0).

NMOA: Varsity Assignors in All Sports – Ms. Pappas presented a proposal for the NMAA office to begin selecting Varsity Regional Assignors for officials in all sports. This would go into effect starting with the 2019-2020 school year. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Perea made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Chavez seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

NMOA: Game Cancellation/ Reschedule Policy (Referenda) – Ms. Pappas presented a proposal whereas in the event games are cancelled or rescheduled, it is the home school's responsibility to inform the Varsity Regional Assignor or sub varsity assignor and the NMAA, in writing, at least 24 hours in advance unless unforeseen circumstances occur (weather, facility, transportation issue). Failure to notify would result in the school being responsible for paying the contest officials. In addition, the Athletic Director or Athletic Secretary for the host school and the officials assigned are expected to confirm scheduled games with one another approximately three days in advance of each contest. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Campbell made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Viramontes seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

Basketball: Replay – Mr. Roy Sanchez, Eldorado HS Boys Basketball Coach & A.D., presented a proposal to adopt the use of replay for the NMAA Basketball State Championships (quarterfinals to finals), in concert with NFHS Rule 2.2.1 This would be in effect immediately for the 2019 state championships. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Campbell made the motion to approve the proposal as presented, contingent on all three facilities utilized during the tournament having the ability to operate a floor monitor. If not feasible, this proposal would go into effect for the 2020 basketball season. Mr. Roybal seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

Seeding/Selection: Ties in District Standings – Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to amend Bylaw 7.11.2 so that in the event of a tie in the regular season district standings, the NMAA Staff may use the six criteria points or any other head to head competition to determine the selection/seeding order between the two teams that are tied. This would go into effect starting with the 2019-2020 school year. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Viramontes made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Campbell seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

Middle School: Transferring to Follow a Coach (Referenda) – Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to amend Bylaw 9.3 R to clarify that students who transfer to follow a coach at the middle school level will be ineligible for high school participation for both the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade school years. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Rubin made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Mabrey seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

Middle School: Annual Meeting Requirement (Referenda) – Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to amend Bylaw 2.5.1, State Meeting, so that each member school, both high school and middle/junior high, must be represented at the annual meeting by its official voter (or the Superintendent designee) or the school is assessed a fine. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Campbell made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Perea seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

Scholastic Eligibility: Cumulative Provision (10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Grade) (Referenda) – Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to amend Bylaw 6.2.1c, Cumulative Provision, whereas only semester grades can be used, and all semester grades starting with the 9<sup>th</sup> grade year must be utilized (the cumulative provision cannot be used for 9<sup>th</sup> grade or middle/junior high students.) Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Affentranger made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Host seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).



Scholastic Eligibility: Cumulative Provision (2.3 GPA) (Referenda) – Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to amend Bylaw 6.2.1c, Cumulative Provision, whereas a student shall have a 2.3 grade point average, based on a 4.0 grading scale, or its equivalent, in order to be eligible using the cumulative provision. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Rubin made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Perea seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed (9-5).

Ejection Policy: Fighting (Referenda) – Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to amend Bylaw 7.7.2 in regards to the protocol used when a participant is ejected for fighting (the first ejection for fighting would be treated as a participant's second overall ejection; a second ejection would then be treated as a participant's third overall ejection). Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Chavez made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Host seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

Scrimmage Definition/Bylaws (Referenda) – Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to consider adjusting the definition of a "scrimmage" as listed in Section 14 of the NMAA Handbook to read: Scrimmage - a practice competition between two (2) or more schools where time and score are not kept, admission is not charged, and paid officials are not used (officials must work without pay, are beginning or registered officials, and are secured locally). A team or individual is allowed one (1) scrimmage day per sport which must occur prior to the school's first game/match/contest in that sport. Participants must meet minimum practice requirements before scrimmaging. The pre-season scrimmage does not count towards game limitations. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Host made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Viramontes seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

NMAA Rules Clinics (Referenda) – Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to make an adjustment to NMAA Bylaw 3.6.1 (and other places throughout the handbook) whereas the deadline for all head coaches to complete the district clinic would be either in person or online at [www.nmact.org](http://www.nmact.org), depending on the sport. Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Mabrey made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Perea seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

### **Consider Adjournment**

Mr. Viramontes asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 12:05 p.m. Mr. Chavez made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Perea seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (14-0).

**Proposal:** Consider adding the New Mexico STEM Challenge as a sanctioned NMAA activity which will culminate with an official championship event.

**Rationale:** The state of New Mexico would like to partner with the NMAA in an effort to promote STEM programs and the Next Generation Science Standards. The creation of the “STEM Challenge” by the Governor’s office will help answer the following four questions:

- How can STEM students and teachers be encouraged to incorporate Next Generation Science Standards to their everyday classroom activities?
- How can students who shine in STEM be recognized statewide?
- How can the job potential of STEM employers in the state be emphasized to students?
- How can these issues be accomplished while encouraging more minorities and girls to participate?

**Budget Impact:** Schools who voluntarily accept the challenge will be asked to use the STEM Challenge Question as a case study in their everyday STEM class curricula with the goal to answer the question. The New Mexico PED has agreed to use their 2019 STEM appropriations to provide professional development and supplies. The National Laboratories, Air Force Research Laboratories, and New Mexico State University will organize STEM mentors from their faculty and staffs for schools that wish to utilize them. Lastly, Facebook has agreed to sponsor travel for winning submissions at the final event.

#### Bylaw 9.4

- A. A Student first participating at the sixth or seventh grade level may compete without reference to his/her immediate or previous scholastic record. The end of the first semester establishes the scholarship requirements for this Student.
- B. An eighth grade Student competing in interscholastic sports at the high school level has made his/her open enrollment choice. The Student may compete without reference to his/her immediate or previous scholastic record. The end of the first semester in 8<sup>th</sup> grade establishes the scholarship requirements for this Student.
- C. A ninth grade Student who has not previously competed in interscholastic sports at the high school level has his/her open enrollment choice. The Student may compete without reference to his/her immediate or previous scholastic record in eighth grade (last semester). The end of the first semester in 9<sup>th</sup> grade establishes the beginning of the scholarship requirements for this Student.

- Finish in regular season district play
- Head to Head
- Wins against district champions regardless of class

- MaxPreps Freeman Rankings (except in tennis)

**\*\*NOTE:** In the event of a tie among criteria points, head to head will be used to break the tie. If there is no head to head competition, or the head to head competition is tied, then MaxPreps Freeman Rankings will be used to break the tie

### *-Out of Season Coaching*

#### Bylaw 7.4

During the off-season a Coaching Staff is allowed 7.5 hours of total contact time per week (during days when school is in session only) to work with student athletes grades 8-12. Sports specific and sports specific conditioning classes are to be included within this allowable timeframe. This provision applies to all school coaches, paid and volunteer. This rule prohibits coaching these individuals on any team (school or non-school sponsored) out-of-season during the school year.

### *-Standardizing Districts*

#### **Basketball and Volleyball**

The District decides on bracket format to determine the District Tournament Champion.

## **Tennis**

Districts may determine team champions by the following methods:

- a. A district tournament in which the seeding is determined specifically by the district in advance of the event, or;

The District sets the format and they report to the NMAA the winning team and individual.

Much is standardized, but how they seed and verify entries is up to the district.

### *-Football: 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Summer Camps*

Consider allowing coaches/athletes to attend one padded/full contact team camp during the summer months (cannot be mandatory). This camp would have to be hosted by a third party (i.e. college/university, USA Football) and would have to be approved by the New Mexico Activities Association. In order to obtain approval, the camp must adhere to certain guidelines to be determined by the NMAA.

### *-Forfeitures / Not Completing Schedules*

#### Bylaw 3.11.4 A

Any school that, without just cause, withdraws its team from a contracted game, or does not pay a forfeiture fee that was due during the same season, may be disciplined or suspended by the Executive Director. Failure of a team to perform for a contracted contest between schools shall constitute a forfeit unless the two schools mutually agree to schedule the contest.

#### Bylaw 4.1.3.A

Schools that fail to complete seasons and/or fulfill contracts in any sport may be placed on probationary status in that sport and must petition the Director and the Board of Directors to be eligible for post-season play the succeeding year. Schools must fulfill financial obligations as set by the Director prior to having their status restored.

Radio broadcasting, video recording, or telecasting a practice session or scrimmage by anyone not connected with the participating school(s) is prohibited without the consent of the school(s) involved.

**B. Regular Season Contests**

Radio broadcasting, video recording, or telecasting a regular season contest is prohibited without the consent of the host school. Exception: The visiting school may video record the contest as long as it is not for broadcast for public viewing. This does not prohibit use of film and tape for sports clips by media representatives.

**Proposal:** 7.7.9 Video Recording/Telecasts/Radio Broadcasting Consent Rule/Procedures

**A. Practice Sessions/Scrimmages**

Radio broadcasting, video recording, video streaming, or telecasting a practice session or scrimmage by anyone not connected with the participating school(s) is prohibited without the consent of the school(s) involved.

**B. Regular Season Contests**

Radio broadcasting, telecasting, or video streaming a regular season contest is prohibited without the consent of the host school. This does not prohibit use of film and tape for sports clips by media representatives. Video recording is allowed.

**Rationale:** It is still very important to protect 3<sup>rd</sup> party video recording at practice sessions; however, it is very difficult to monitor 3<sup>rd</sup> party filming at a game. Spectators are capable of recording on cell phones, and many games/events can be viewed on the internet. It makes sense to change verbiage and adjust with the times.

Students participating in two sports concurrently at the interscholastic level must participate in a minimum of one quarter (1/4) of the varsity contests scheduled, but in no event less than two (2) varsity contests to be eligible for post-season competition. A player who sustains an injury that precludes participation in a minimum of two (2) contests during the regular season may participate in post-season competition provided the student has been on the team roster throughout the season. In addition, the injury must be certified in writing by a licensed medical physician and submitted to the Director as well as kept on file by the school principal. For this exception to apply, the injured player cannot have participated in any other sport (inside or outside of the school) during the regular sports season.

**Proposal: 7.6.5 Minimum Contests for Post-Season Competition Eligibility (Individual)**

Students must participate in a minimum of one quarter (1/4) of the varsity contests scheduled to be eligible for post-season competition. A player who sustains an injury that precludes participation in one quarter of the varsity contests during the regular season may participate in post-season competition provided the student has been on the team roster throughout the season. In addition, the injury must be certified in writing by a licensed medical physician and submitted to the Director as well as kept on file by the school principal. For this exception to apply, the injured player cannot have participated in any other sport (inside or outside of the school) during the regular sports season.

**Note: JV players can be moved up for post season play without playing in a ¼ of the varsity contests.**

**Rationale:** Bylaw 7.6.5 was written for two sports only due to Fall academically ineligible athletes not able to compete in a ¼ of the contests after the 9 week grades were completed. Now that we use semester grades for eligibility, this bylaw should change to include all athletes..

Prior to participation, written parental consent, allowing qualified medical professionals (QMP) to provide sports medicine services, must be on file with the school and provided on the NMAA’s Consent to Treat form.

A QMP is defined as a medical/osteopathic physician, physician’s assistant, nurse practitioner, or athletic trainer licensed by the state of New Mexico (or the state in which the student-athlete is located at time of injury or illness).

**Rationale:**

Parental consent for minor athletes is generally required for sports medicine services. In the absence of a parent/legal guardian, this proposal ensures athletes have access to available medical care and/or sports medicine services.

## CONSENT TO TREAT FORM

Parental consent for minor athletes is generally required for sports medicine services, defined as services including, but not limited to, evaluation, diagnosis, first aid and emergency care, stabilization, treatment, rehabilitation and referral of injuries and illnesses, along with decisions on return to play after injury or illness. Occasionally, those minor athletes require sports medicine services before, during and after their participation in sport-related activities, and under circumstances in which a parent or legal guardian is not immediately available to provide consent pertaining to the specific condition affecting the athlete. In such instances, it may be imperative to the health and safety of those athletes that sports medicine services necessary to prevent harm be provided immediately, and not be withheld or delayed because of problems obtaining consent of a parent/guardian.

Accordingly, the New Mexico Activities Association (NMAA) requires as a pre-condition of participation in interscholastic activities, that a parent/guardian provide written consent to the rendering of necessary sports medicine services to their minor athlete by a qualified medical provider (QMP) employed or otherwise designated by the school/district/NMAA to the extent the QMP deems necessary to prevent harm to the student/athlete. It is understood that a QMP may be an athletic trainer, medical/osteopathic physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner licensed by the state of New Mexico (or the state in which the student/athlete is located at the time the injury/illness occurs), and who is acting in accordance with the scope of practice under their designated state license and any other requirement imposed by New Mexico law. In emergency situations, the QMP may also be a certified paramedic or emergency medical technician, but only for the purpose of providing emergency care and transport as designated by state regulation and standing protocols, and not for making decisions about return to play.

I understand that the school/district/NMAA may employ or designate QMP's (as defined above) to provide sports medicine services (as also defined above) to the school's interscholastic athletes before, during or after sport-related activities, and that on certain occasions there are sport-related activities conducted away from the school/district facilities during which other QMP's are responsible for providing such sports medicine services. I hereby give consent to any such QMP to provide any such sports medicine services to the above-named minor. The QMP may make decisions on return to play in accordance with the defined scope of practice under the designated state license, except as otherwise limited by New Mexico law. I also understand that documentation pertaining to any sports medicine services provided to the above-named minor, may be maintained by the QMP. I hereby authorize the QMP who provides such services to the above-named minor to disclose such information about the athlete's injury/illness, assessment, condition, treatment, rehabilitation and return to play status to those who, in the professional judgment of the QMP, are required to have such information in order to assure optimum treatment for and recovery from the injury/illness, and to protect the health and safety of the minor. I understand such disclosures may be made to above-named minor's coaches, athletic director, school nurse, any classroom teacher required to provide academic accommodation to assure the student/athlete's recovery and safe return to activity, and any treating QMP.

If the parent believes that the minor is in need of further treatment or rehabilitation services for the injury/illness, the minor may be treated by the physician or provider of his/her choice. I understand, however, that all decisions regarding same day return to activity following injury/illness shall be made by the QMP employed/designated by the school/district/NMAA.

*Part One – Emergency Information Form – To be completed and signed by the parent or guardian and student athlete.*

*Part Two – Annual Pre-participation History Form – To be completed and signed by the parent or guardian and student athlete.*

*Part Three – Annual Pre-participation Physical Examination Form – To be completed and signed by the examining medical provider.*

#### **Rationale:**

The NMAA has employed the use of the 4<sup>th</sup> Pre-participation Evaluation (PPE) Monograph and recommended its use by its member schools for sports physical since 2014. The 4<sup>th</sup> PPE Monograph was developed by The American Academy of Pediatrics in coordination with The American Academy of Family Physicians, American College of Sports Medicine, American Medical Society for Sports Medicine, American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine, and American Osteopathic Academy of Sports. It is considered the most comprehensive sports physical form available and endorsed and recommended by the National Federation of State High School Associations.

Requiring this form for all pre-participation evaluations ensures a more consistent and comprehensive evaluation which, in turn, raises the level of health and safety for all student participants.

**Proposal:**

Sanction a girls' only wrestling division beginning next school year (2019-2020)

- Participants will qualify for the state championship tournament via one of two regional qualifying tournaments
- Schools will be aligned regionally, keeping current district schools together
- Each region will qualify four participants per weight class to the state tournament
- Qualifying participants will compete at the state tournament with medals awarded to the top three participants
- Trophies will be awarded to the top three teams
- Girls may compete in boys' events during the regular season but must compete in the girls' division during the post-season

**Rationale:** High School Girls wrestling continues to grow across the country. Sixteen states currently sanction Girls Wrestling with ten of those being sanctioned within the last two years. Girls wrestling in New Mexico has also grown steadily over the past few years since the inclusion of a Girls Exhibition Event held during the 2018 and 2019 State Wrestling Championships. While the total number of girl participants is still relatively low compared to the boys, there are now enough participants to begin sanctioning an official Girls' Wrestling State Championship and it is anticipated that its inclusion will lead to increased female participation in the future.

**School Budget Impact:**

- Separate girls' events, including the state qualifying event, will incur more costs for schools to attend however; it is anticipated that initially, most girls' events will be held in conjunction with already scheduled boys' tournaments which should minimize school cost.
- Schools should be minimally impacted by additional coaching hires. Girls can continue to practice with boys in joint practices keeping coaching staffs relatively status quo. However; schools will have to designate an individual or individuals to coach/chaperone girls anytime the boys and girls are at separate locations on the same date. Last year, 62 of 63 schools had more than one coach on staff.

**NMAA Budget Impact:** The NMAA has already provided a girls' exhibition event during the last two state championships and has already accounted for the additional participants this proposal would include. The NMAA would have to purchase additional trophies and medals for qualifying individuals/teams which would result in a minimal net decrease.

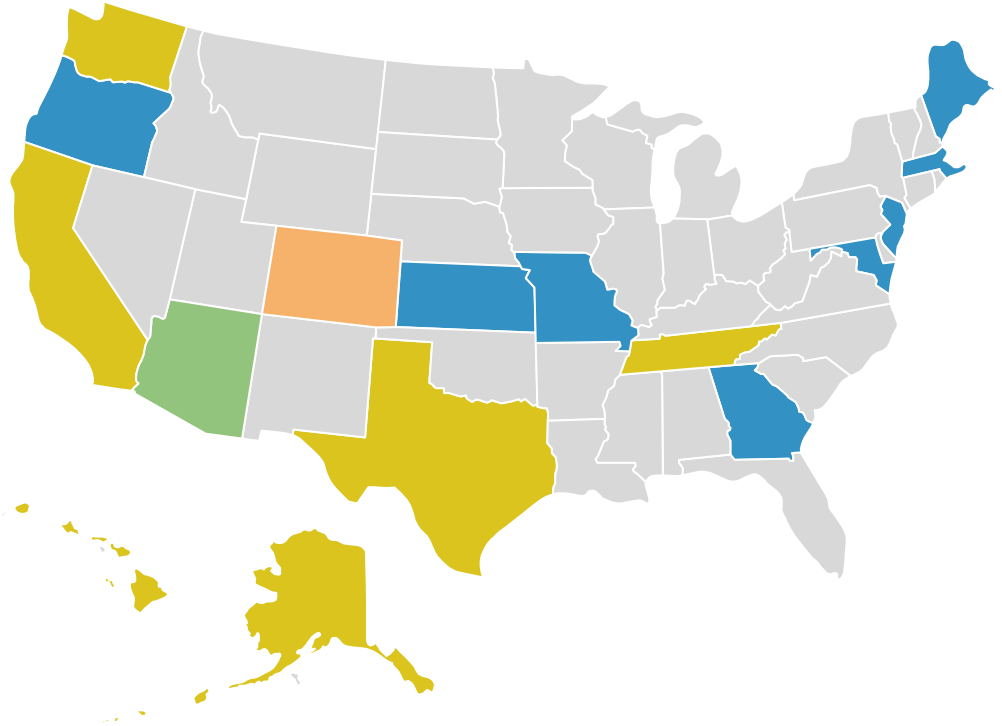

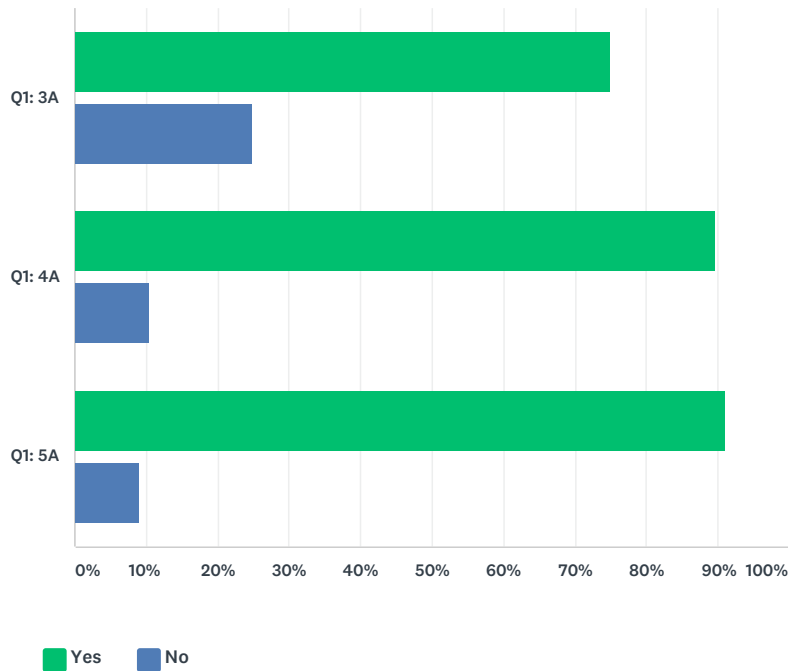

*Note – Failure to post pitch count numbers to MaxPreps within 24 hours will result in fines and/or other sanctions assessed to the school as determined by the Executive Director.*

*Proposed*

*Coaches must post the pitch counts for all players from each game to MaxPreps, along with results, within 24 hours. (Coaches are responsible for players from their own team)*

*Note – Failure to post pitch count numbers to MaxPreps within 24 hours will result in the following:*

*1<sup>st</sup> Offense – Warning*

*2<sup>nd</sup> & Subsequent Offenses – Coach will be suspended for one game.*

**Rationale:** Although we have had the pitch count regulations in place for three years, many coaches still do not post the necessary data to MaxPreps in a timely manner. The fine does not seem like enough of a sanction to keep coaches on task, thus it is felt that a stricter penalty should be issued when pitch counts are not reported.
