

## **2008-2009 Eligibility Synopsis** **(7/01/2008-12/19/2008)**

### **Bylaw 6.5.2**

Albuquerque High School- a junior transfer student petitioned the transfer rule due to a military transfer requesting varsity athletic eligibility at Albuquerque High School. The student lives with another relative within the Albuquerque High attendance zone. The NMAA denied the petition for varsity eligibility. The petition was appealed to the Appeal's committee and the ruling was overturned.

Albuquerque High School- a senior transfer student petitioned the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility at Albuquerque High School. The student lives with another relative within the Albuquerque High attendance zone. The NMAA denied the petition for varsity eligibility. The petition was appealed to the Appeal's committee and the ruling was overturned. The student was deemed eligible for varsity athletic participation after 10 days of practicing with the team prior to participation in the first competition.

Albuquerque High School- a returning senior student to Albuquerque High. The student is petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility who participated in the sport of basketball only at the previous school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility in the sport of basketball for 90 school days, however granted eligibility immediately for varsity athletic participation in all other sports after practicing with the team for 10 days prior to the first competition. (Rule 6.6.2 A 14)

Albuquerque High School- a sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student made the open enrollment choice to attend another high school as a freshman then recently transferred to Albuquerque High for the 2008-2009 school year. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility; however the student is eligible for sub-varsity athletics. The petition was appealed to the Appeals Review Committee; the decision made by the NMAA was overturned.

Artesia High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting sub-varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA granted the request for immediate sub-varsity eligibility.

Artesia High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting sub-varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school and only participated in the sport of volleyball while in attendance there. The student was granted immediate eligibility in all other sports except volleyball.

Aztec High School- a sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic participation at Aztec High School. The student did not participate in dance at the previous school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity athletic eligibility, however granted immediate varsity eligibility in the sport of dance.

Aztec High School- a freshman transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic participation at Aztec High School. The student had competed at another member school as an eighth grader making the open enrollment choice, therefore the NMAA denied the request for varsity athletic eligibility, however the student is granted immediate sub-varsity participation.

Belen High School- a sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic participation at Belen High School. The student transferred from another member school within the state. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Belen High School- a junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic participation at Belen High School. The student transferred from another member school within the state. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Belen High School- a sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic participation at Belen High School. The student transferred from another member school within the state with out establishing a bona fide residence within the Belen attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Bloomfield High School- junior transfer student to Bloomfield High School requesting varsity eligibility. The student attended another member school for the 08-09 season and participated for more than 5 days in the sport of basketball. The student then transferred to Bloomfield High School for the remainder of the school year. The NMAA ruled ineligible for all levels of athletic participation in the sport of basketball at Bloomfield High School and 90 school days of varsity ineligibility in all other sports. The NMAA granted immediate sub-varsity athletic eligibility in all sports except basketball. The petition was appealed to the appeals committee where the decision made by the NMAA was modified allowing sub varsity participation only in the sport of basketball.

Bosque School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting sub-varsity eligibility. The student made their open enrollment choice as a freshman, therefore is ineligible for varsity athletic participation. The NMAA the request for sub-varsity eligibility.

Capital High School- freshman transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student made the open enrollment choice by participating at another member school as an eighth grader. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Capital High School- freshman transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student made the open enrollment choice by participating at another member school as an eighth grader. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. The petition was appealed to the Appeal's Committee and the decision was overturned. The student was granted immediate varsity eligibility.

Capital High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student transferred from another member school without establishing a bona fide residence within the Capital attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. This petition was appealed to the Review committee where the decision made by the NMAA was upheld.

Capital High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic participation. As the student did not leave the previous school in good standing the NMAA denied the request for varsity athletic participation for all Fall sports. The petition was appealed to the Appeal Review committee where the decision made by the NMAA was overturned.

Cibola High School- a junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule for varsity athletic participation who transferred from another member school without establishing bona fide residence within the Cibola attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Cibola High School- a junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule for varsity athletic participation who transferred from another member school without establishing bona fide residence within the Cibola attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Cliff High School- incoming freshman requesting varsity athletic participation petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended and participated in athletics as an eighth grader at another member school, making the open enrollment choice. The NMAA denied the request for varsity athletic participation.

Clayton High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student transferred from another member school and participated in the sport of basketball at the previous school. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility in all sports except the sport of basketball.

Clayton High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic participation. The student's parents separated, the student moved with the parent to a new attendance zone while the other parent remained in the attendance zone of the member school to which the student previously attended. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Clovis High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic participation living with relatives in the Clovis attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Clovis High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility who attended another member school after relocating and establishing a bona fide residence in the Clovis High School attendance zone. The student used eligibility retention after remaining at the previous member school for the remainder of the school year then transferring to Clovis High School. The NMAA denied the request varsity eligibility and as a senior the student is unable to practice with the team.

Del Norte High School- freshman transfer student mid year petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student transferred from a school out of state however does not reside in the Del Norte attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Del Norte High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student transferred from a school out of state however did not establish a bona fide residence in the Del Norte attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Del Norte High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student transferred from another member school without establishing bona fide residence within the Del Norte attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Des Moines High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility at Des Moines. The student transferred from a school out of state. However the student and family have always resided in the Des Moines attendance zone and did not establish a new bona fide residence, giving up eligibility at Des Moines when the student attended another school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. This petition was appealed to the Appeal's Review committee; the decision made by the NMAA was upheld.

Des Moines High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility at Des Moines. The student transferred from a school out of state. The student and family have

always resided in the Des Moines attendance zone and did not establish a new bona fide residence. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. This petition was appealed to the Appeal Review committee; the decision made by the NMAA was upheld. The petition was then appealed to the Board of Directors and the decision made by the NMAA and Review committee was upheld.

Des Moines High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility at Des Moines. The student transferred from a school out of state. However the student and family always resided in the Des Moines attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. The petition was appealed to the Appeal's Review committee, the decision of the NMAA was upheld.

Dexter High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student transferred from a school out of state, however does not reside in the Del Norte attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility, as a senior the student is unable to practice with the team during the period of ineligibility.

Dora High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student transferred from another member school without establishing bona fide residence within the Dora attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Eldorado High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student transferred from another member school without establishing bona fide residence within the Eldorado attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Elida High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student transferred from another member school without establishing bona fide residence within the Elida attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Espanola Valley High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student transferred from another member school without establishing bona fide residence within the Espanola Valley attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Eunice High School- freshman transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student transferred from another member school where the student participated as an eighth grader at the previous school, making the open enrollment choice. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Eunice High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student transferred from another member school and did not leave his previous school in good standing. The NMAA denied the request for all levels of athletic eligibility for the remainder of the 08-09 school year. The student can deem eligibility if stays in good standing for the remainder of the year.

Gallup Catholic High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Gallup Catholic High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. As a senior, the student is unable to practice with the team during this period of ineligibility.

Gallup High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility at Gallup High School. The student transferred from another member school without establishing a bona fide residence within the Gallup High attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Hatch Valley High School- freshman transfer student petitioning the transfer rule for varsity athletic eligibility after returning to Hatch. The student lived and attended a school out of state. The student and family relocated and established a new bona fide residence within the Hatch attendance area. The NMAA granted the request for varsity eligibility.

Hatch Valley High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the request for varsity athletic eligibility. The student is living with other relatives within the Hatch attendance area after attending another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Hatch Valley High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility after attending another member school the previous year. The student did not established bona fide residence within the Hatch attendance area, the NMAA denied varsity eligibility.

Hobbs High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student's parents are divorced and the student is living with a parent in the Hobbs attendance zone while the other parent remains in the attendance zone of the member school previously attended by the student. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility; as a senior the student is unable to practice with the team during the ineligibility period.

Hobbs High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended a member school and is now living with members outside of the immediate family. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility; because the student is a senior, the student is unable to practice with the team during this period of ineligibility.

Hope Christian Schools- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student attended another member school the previous year. The student made the open enrollment choice as a freshman to attend another member school, the NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility

Hope Christian Schools- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student attended another member school the previous year therefore the NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility

Hope Christian Schools- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student attended another member school the previous year. The student made the open enrollment choice as a freshman to attend another member school, the NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Jemez Valley High School- junior transfer student to Jemez Valley high School without a bona fide residence move. According to Form C, the student did not leave the previous school in good standing. The NMAA denied all levels of athletic eligibility for 180 school days.

Jemez Valley High School- two senior transfer students petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The students attended another member school the previous year. The students made the open enrollment choice as a freshman to attend another member school, the NMAA denied varsity eligibility. Because these students are senior, they are unable to practice with the team during this period of ineligibility.

La Cueva High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility after attending another member school the previous years. The student has lived within the La Cueva attendance zone; however the student made the open enrollment choice as a freshman to attend another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility, as a senior the student is unable to practice with the team during this period of ineligibility.

La Cueva High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility after attending another member school the previous years. The student has lived within the La Cueva attendance zone; however the student made the open enrollment choice as a freshman to attend another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

La Cueva High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility after previously attending another member school. The student is living with relatives within the La Cueva attendance area. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility, as a senior the student is unable to practice with the team during this period of ineligibility.

La Cueva High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility who attended another member school after the student and family relocated and established a bona fide residence in the La Cueva High School attendance zone. The student used eligibility retention after remaining at the previous member school for the remainder of the school year then choosing to later attend La Cueva High School. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

La Cueva High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility after previously attending another member school. The student has lived within the La Cueva attendance zone; however the student made the open enrollment choice as a freshman to attend another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Lake Arthur High School- two senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility after previously attending another member school the previous year. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. As a senior, the student is unable to practice with the team during this period of ineligibility.

Los Alamos High School- senior transfer student requesting varsity eligibility after previously attending another member school without establishing a bona fide residence within the Los Alamos attendance area. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. As a senior, the student is unable to practice with the team during this period of ineligibility.

Los Lunas High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility after previously attending another member school. The student has always lived within the Los Lunas attendance zone; however the student made the open enrollment choice as a freshman to attend another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Lovington High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility after previously attending another member school. As the student participated in the sport of football during the 2008-2009 school year at the previous school, the NMAA granted the request of immediate eligibility in all sports except football. The decision made by the NMAA was appealed to the Appeal's Review committee and the decision made by the NMAA was upheld. However, the committee granted immediate sub-varsity athletic participation during this period of ineligibility.

Mayfield High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student is living with relatives through power of attorney and the relatives reside in the Mayfield attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility as custodial rights were not ordered by a district judge. As a senior, the student is unable to practice with the team during this period of ineligibility.

Mayfield High School- freshman transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student participating as an eighth grader at another member school and attended another member school at the beginning of the year making the open enrollment choice. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Menaul High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student transferred from another member school without establishing bona fide residence within the Menaul attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Menaul High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student transferred from another member school without establishing bona fide residence within the Menaul attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

The student attended another member school for a short period of time and participated in athletics while in attendance there. The student was homeschooled the remainder of the year and did not participate in athletics while being homeschooled. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity athletic participation as the student already sat out the ineligibility period while in home school.

McCurdy High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student transferred from another member school without establishing a bona fide residence within the attendance zone. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. As a senior, the student is unable to practice with the team during this period of ineligibility.

Oñate High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student transferred after attending another member school the previous year without establishing a bona fide residence within the Oñate attendance area. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Piedra Vista High School- sophomore transfer student requesting varsity eligibility at Piedra Vista High School. The student previously attended another member school without establishing a bona fide residence. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Robertson High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student attended another member school the previous year and transferred without

establishing a bona fide residence within the Robertson Attendance area. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Roswell High School- freshman transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity athletic eligibility. The student participated in athletics as an eighth grader at another member school during the fall. The student has already sat out the ineligibility period during the spring of her eighth grade year. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility.

Sandia High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student attended another member school the previous year and transferred without establishing a bona fide residence within the Sandia attendance area. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility.

Sandia High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student attended another member school the previous year and transferred without establishing a bona fide residence within the Santa Fe attendance area. Therefore pursuant to Rule 2.2.2 the NMAA granted immediate varsity eligibility.

Robertson High School- incoming freshman student to Robertson High School requesting varsity eligibility. The student participated in athletics as an eighth grader, however based on the circumstances surrounding the student, pursuant to Rule 2.2.2 the NMAA granted the request for varsity athletic participation.

Deming High School- re-classified senior student at Deming High School requesting a fifth year of athletic participation. The NMAA denied all levels of athletic participation for the 08-09 school year.

On the initial petition the student and family provided false information based in an effort to obtain eligibility based on bona fide residence. The NMAA ruled ineligible for any level of athletics for 180 school days.

On the initial petition the student and family provided false information based in an effort to obtain eligibility based on bona fide residence. The NMAA ruled ineligible for any level of athletics for 180 school days. The petition was appealed, the committee upheld the decision by the NMAA, the petition was appealed to the Board of Directors, the decision was overturned granting immediate varsity eligibility.

Piedra Vista- junior transfer student to Piedra Vista requesting varsity eligibility. On the initial petition the student and family provided false information based in an effort to obtain eligibility based on bona fide residence. The NMAA ruled ineligible for any level of athletics for 180 school days. The petition was appealed, the committee modified the decision made by the NMAA granting immediate sub-varsity eligibility for the 08-09 school year.

Sandia High School- junior transfer student to Sandia High School requesting varsity eligibility. On the initial petition the student and family provided false information based on an effort to obtain eligibility based on bona fide residence. The NMAA ruled ineligible for any level of athletics for 180 school days. The petition was appealed and the appeal committee modified the decision allow sub-varsity athletic participation only in the sport of basketball.

Volcano Vista High School- junior transfer student to Volcano Vista requesting varsity eligibility. After further investigation, on the initial petition the student and family provided false information based on an effort to obtain eligibility based on bona residence. The NMAA ruled ineligible for any level of athletic participation for 180 school days.

### **Bylaw 6.2.1**

Farmington High School- junior transfer student requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended a another member school, after further investigation, the student participated in a summer program and later followed a coach to Farmington High. The NMAA denied all levels of athletic participation for 180 school days. The petition was appealed to the Appeal's Review Committee where the decision was modified, granting eligibility after 90 school days from the date of enrollment.

The student attended another member school, the Hardship Review committee reviewed the petition and determined a hardship does exist which would substantiate the granting of immediate varsity eligibility.

Roswell High School- sophomore transfer student requesting varsity eligibility based on a hardship. The student previously attended another member school. The Hardship committee reviewed the petition and determined a hardship does exist which would substantiate the granting of varsity eligibility.

Roswell High School- re-classified transfer student requesting a fifth year of eligibility based on a hardship. The student previously attended another member school. The Hardship committee reviewed the petition and determined a hardship does not exist which would substantiate the granting of a fifth year of eligibility.

Moriarty High School- reclassified senior student requesting a fifth year of eligibility based on a hardship petition. The Hardship review committee reviewed the petition and determined a hardship does not exist. The petition was appealed to the appeal's review committee. The Appeal Review committee overturned the decision made by the NMAA and the Hardship committee.
