

2008-2009 Eligibility Synopsis **(01/05/2009-01/31/2009)**

Bylaw 6.5.2

Cibola High School- sophomore transfer student to Cibola High School petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity athletic eligibility. As a sophomore the student is eligible for sub-varsity.

East Mountain High School- sophomore transfer student to East Mountain High School petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity athletic eligibility. As a sophomore the student is eligible for sub-varsity athletic participation.

Española High School- sophomore transfer student to Española High School petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school and participated in the sport of basketball for the 08-09 season. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility; additionally the student is ineligible at all levels of athletic participation in the sport of basketball for the remainder of the 08-09 season. The petition was appealed to the appeal's committee where the decision made by the NMAA was modified allowing sub-varsity athletic participation in all sports including basketball.

Farmington High School- junior transfer student to Farmington High School petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. The student was granted immediate sub-varsity eligibility during the period of varsity ineligibility.

Peñasco High School- junior transfer student to Peñasco High School petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. The student was granted immediate sub-varsity eligibility during the period of varsity ineligibility.

Piedra Vista High School- sophomore transfer student to Piedra Vista High School petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended a school out of state and lives with a relative. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. The student was granted immediate sub-varsity eligibility during the period of varsity ineligibility.

Ruidoso High School- sophomore transfer student to Ruidoso High School petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school and participated in the sport of basketball for the 08-09 season. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility for 90 school days; additionally the student is ineligible at all levels of athletic participation in the sport of basketball for the remainder of the 08-09 season.

Shiprock High School- junior transfer student to Shiprock High School petitioning the transfer rule requesting varsity eligibility. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied the request for varsity eligibility. The student was granted immediate sub-varsity eligibility during the period of varsity ineligibility.

Bylaw 6.6.2

Cimarron High School- sophomore transfer student from a non member school requesting for varsity eligibility. The student did not participate in athletics while in attendance there. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility.

Desert Academy- transfer student from another member school requesting varsity eligibility. According to Form C from the previous school, the student did not participate in athletics while in attendance there. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility, the student must practice 5 days with the team prior to participating in a competition

Evangel Christian School- senior transfer student from another member school requesting varsity eligibility. According to Form C from the previous school, the student did not participate in athletics there. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility, as a senior the student must practice 5 days with the team prior to participating in a competition.

Menaul High School- junior transfer student from another member school requesting varsity eligibility. According to Form C from the previous school, the student did not participate in athletics there. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility.

Moriarty High School- senior transfer student from another member school requesting varsity eligibility. According to Form C from the previous school, the student did not participate in athletics there. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility, as a senior the student must practice 5 days with the team prior to participating in a competition.

Moriarty High School- senior transfer student from another member school requesting for varsity eligibility. According to Form C from the previous school, the student did not participate in athletics there. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility, as a senior the student must practice 5 days with the team prior to participating in a competition.

Mosquero High School- sophomore transfer student from an out of state school requesting for varsity eligibility. According to Form C from the previous school, the student did not participate in athletics there. The NMAA granted the request for varsity eligibility after attending school for 10 days and practicing 5 days with the team prior to participating in a competition.

Bylaw 6.5.3

Clovis High School- a sophomore transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school outside of the state. The student and family relocated due to a military transfer within the Clovis High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility.

Des Moines High School- a sophomore transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school outside of the state. The student and family relocated within the Des Moines High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility.

Grants High School- a sophomore transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school outside of the state. The student and family relocated within the Grants High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility.

Kirtland Central High School- a sophomore transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school to which was court ordered. The student completed the program at the previous school, returning to him home attendance area of Kirtland Central. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility.

Mayfield High School- a junior transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended another member school. The student and family relocated within the Mayfield High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility.

Piedra Vista High School- a junior transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school outside of the state. The student and family relocated within the Piedra Vista High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility.

Roswell High School- a senior transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school outside of the state. The student and family relocated within the Roswell High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility, after 5 days of practice with the team prior to competing in a competition.

Roswell High School- a freshman transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended another member school and participated for two days only. The student and family relocated within the Roswell High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility.

Tucumcari High School- a sophomore transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school outside of the state. The student and family relocated within the Tucumcari High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate eligibility.

Bylaw 6.4.3

Rio Grande High School- sophomore transfer student to Rio Grande High School who is living with legal guardians to which were judge appointed authority. The NMAA granted immediate varsity eligibility at Rio Grande High School.

Aztec High School- sophomore transfer student to Rio Grande High School who is living with legal guardians to which were judge appointed. The NMAA granted immediate varsity eligibility at Aztec High School.

Bylaw 10.5

Pecos High School- home school student living in the Pecos attendance area requesting athletic eligibility at Pecos High School. The NMAA granted immediate eligibility for one athletic activity for the 08-09 school year.

Bylaw 6.5.6

Los Alamos High School- foreign exchange student currently attending the Los Alamos High School and is part of a formal program from the C.S.I.E.T. approved list meeting all age and academic requirements. The NMAA granted immediate athletic eligibility for up to one year at Los Alamos High School.

Robertson High School- foreign exchange student currently attending the Robertson High School and is part of a formal program from the C.S.I.E.T. approved list meeting all age and academic requirements. The NMAA granted immediate athletic eligibility for up to one year at Robertson High School.

Hardship Petitions

Valley High School- junior transfer student from another member school. The student previously attended another member school and returned back to Valley High School. The Hardship Committee determined that a hardship did not exist. Therefore the student is ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date of enrollment there.
