

2008-2009 Eligibility Synopsis **(03/01/2009-03/30/2009)**

Bylaw 6.5.2

Cibola High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previous attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date the petition was submitted.

Cibola High School- two junior transfer students petitioning the transfer rule. The student previous attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date the petition was submitted.

Del Norte High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previous attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date the petition was submitted.

Valley High School- three junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previous attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation. However, as the student transferred at the beginning of the year the student has already sat out the 90 day ineligibility period and is therefore eligible for varsity athletic participation.

Valley High School- senior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previous attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation. However, as the student transferred at the beginning of the year the student has already sat out the 90 day ineligibility period and is therefore eligible for varsity athletic participation. As a senior, the student must practice for 5 days prior to competing in the first competition.

Eldorado High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previous attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date the petition was submitted.

Artesia High School- freshman transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation.

Las Cruces High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date of enrollment.

Laguna Acoma High School- a sophomore transfer student since the beginning of the year petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date of enrollment.

Los Alamos High School- a freshman transfer student since the beginning of the year petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date of enrollment.

Sandia High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school and transferred at the beginning of the 08-09 school year. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date of enrollment.

Sandia High School- sophomore transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date of enrollment.

Elida High School- junior transfer student petitioning the transfer rule. The student previous attended another member school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity athletic participation for 90 school days from the date of enrollment, and due to the circumstances from the students previous school, the student is ineligible for all levels of athletic participation for the remainder of the 08-09 school year.

Dora High School- sophomore transfer student from another member school requesting for varsity eligibility. The student did not participate in the sport of baseball while in attendance there. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility in the sport of baseball.

Elida High School- sophomore transfer student from another member school requesting for varsity eligibility. The student did not participate in the sport of baseball while in attendance there. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility in the sport of baseball.

House High School- senior transfer student from a non member school requesting for varsity eligibility. The student did not participate in athletics while in attendance there. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility. As a senior, the student must be in attendance for 10 school days and practice with the team for 5 days prior to participating in the first competition.

Goddard High School- a senior transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended another member school. The student and family relocated within the Goddard High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility.

Loving High School- a junior transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school out of state. The student and family relocated within the Loving High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility.

Hot Springs High School- a sophomore transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school out of state. The student and family relocated within the Hot Springs High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility.

Artesia High School- a junior transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended a school out of state. The student and family relocated within the Artesia High attendance zone. The NMAA granted the request for immediate varsity eligibility.

Bylaw 6.5.6

Los Alamos High School- foreign exchange student currently attending the Los Alamos High School and is part of a formal program from the C.S.I.E.T. approved list meeting all age and academic requirements. The NMAA granted immediate athletic eligibility for up to one year at Los Alamos High School.

Bylaw 6.1.4

Logan High School- current student at Logan High School petitioning for varsity eligibility. The student exceeds the age limitation turning 19 prior to September 1. The NMAA ruled ineligible for athletic participation. The student petitioned to the appeal committee where the decision was upheld. The student has petitioned to the Board of Directors and is still in the process.

Moriarty High School- current student at Moriarty High School petitioning for varsity eligibility. The student exceeds the age limitation turning 19 prior to September 1. The NMAA ruled ineligible for athletic participation.

Bylaw 6.3.3

Sandia High School- charter school student attending a charter school. The student lives in another attendance zone other than Sandia High school. Due to the NMAA being in the process of evaluating the State Statute as it relates to charter schools, the NMAA granted immediate sub-varsity eligibility only at this time.
