**Adrian, Alsup and Parks To Be Inducted
Into NMAA Hall of Fame**

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - The New Mexico Activities Association would like to announce that Randy Adrian, Don Alsup, and TJ Parks will be inducted into the New Mexico Activities Association's Hall of Fame on Thursday, March 8, 2007.

The induction ceremony and lunch on March 8 will be held at the Albuquerque Wyndham Airport Hotel and is scheduled to begin at 12:00 PM. All three gentlemen will also be honored during the Class 4A Girls State Championship Basketball game on Friday, March 9th at 6:00 PM.

The NMAA has served as the governing body for interscholastic activities in New Mexico since 1921. The NMAA Hall of Fame inducts individuals who have made a significant contribution to interscholastic activities and education in the state of New Mexico over an extended period of time.

Randy Adrian

Randy Adrian's distinguished career spanned twenty-five years in coaching, teaching and administration. He was a member of the Clovis Wildcat football coaching staff that won six state championship titles (five straight). Randy served the NMAA on the NMAA Executive Board, Hall of Pride and Honor Committee, Classification Committee and the Football Sports Specific Committee. In 1999 he was honored with the NMAA's Distinguished Service Award. Randy also officiated basketball for thirty-one years and was named the National Federation Official of the Year for New Mexico in 2000.

Don Alsup

Don Alsup grew up in Roswell, New Mexico; where he dedicated nearly three decades positively influencing the lives of students. In 1995, the NMAA awarded Don with the NMAA's Distinguished Service Award. He was a member of the NMAA's Executive Committee for five years, was the Chairman of the NMAA Commission for three years, and also served on the NMAA Review, Promotion, Audit, and Re-Classification committees. During his eighteen year tenure as the Roswell ISD Athletic Director, the two Roswell High Schools won over thirty team state championships.

TJ Parks

TJ Parks, former Tucumcari Rattler, began his teaching and coaching career with the Tatum Municipal School District in 1981. TJ Parks has spent over twenty-five years educating and coaching students. His support of the New Mexico Activities Association and its mission has included service on the NMAA Executive Committee, the Budget Committee, the Audit Committee and two terms on the NMAA's Review Committee.
