

2010-2011 Eligibility Synopsis **(02/01/2010-02/28/2010)**

Bylaw 6.5.6

Piedra Vista High School- four foreign exchange students currently attending Piedra Vista High School and is part of a formal program from the C.S.I.E.T. approved list meeting all age and academic requirements. The NMAA granted immediate athletic eligibility for one year at Piedra Vista High School.

Bylaw 6.6.2

Clovis High School- freshman transfer student to Clovis High School. The student did not participate in athletics the previous year. The NMAA ruled eligible immediately for varsity athletic participation.

Grady High School- junior transfer student to Grady High School. The student did not participate in athletics the previous year. The NMAA ruled eligible immediately for varsity athletic participation at Grady High School.

Belen High School- senior transfer student to Belen High School. The student did not participate in athletics the previous year. The NMAA ruled eligible immediately for varsity athletic participation at Belen High School.

Bylaw 6.5.2

Miyamura High School- sophomore transfer student to Miyamura High School petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school and participated in the sport of wrestling for the 09-10 school year. The NMAA denied varsity eligibility for 90 school days from the date of enrollment in all sports and ruled ineligible for all levels of participation in the sport of wrestling. As a sophomore, the student is eligible for sub-varsity participation.

Miyamura High School- sophomore transfer student to Miyamura High School petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school and participated in the sport of basketball for the 09-10 school year. The NMAA denied varsity eligibility for 90 school days from the date of enrollment in all sports and ruled ineligible for all levels of participation in the sport of basketball. As a sophomore, the student is eligible for sub-varsity participation.

Los Lunas High School- junior transfer student to Los Lunas High School petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school and participated in the sport of baseball at the previous school. The NMAA denied varsity eligibility for 90 school days from the date of enrollment in the sport of baseball. Pursuant to 6.6.2, did not participate, the student is eligible for varsity participation all other sports As a junior, the student is eligible for sub-varsity in the sport of baseball.

Cleveland High School- junior transfer student to Cleveland. The student previously attended a boarding school. The NMAA denied varsity athletic eligibility participation. The student is eligible for sub-varsity participation.

Gallup High School- freshman transfer student to Gallup High School. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied varsity eligibility.

Bylaw 6.5.3

Dexter High School- sophomore transfer student to Dexter High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Dexter High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Dexter High School in all sports

Elida High School- sophomore transfer student to Elida High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Elida High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Elida High School in all sports

Gallup High School- sophomore transfer student to Gallup High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Gallup High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Gallup High School in all sports

Hot Springs High School- freshman transfer student to Hot Springs High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Hot Springs High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Hot Springs High School in all sports once academic eligibly has been achieved.

Gallup High School- junior transfer student to Gallup High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Gallup High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Gallup High School in all sports.

Santa Fe High School- freshman transfer student to Santa Fe High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Santa Fe High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Santa Fe High School in all sports

Bylaw 6.4.3

San Jon High School- students with court ordered documentation living at a treatment facility. The NMAA granted immediate varsity eligibility at San Jon High School.
