

2010-2011 Eligibility Synopsis **(01/01/2010-01/31/2010)**

Bylaw 6.6.2

Artesia High School- sophomore transfer student to Artesia High School. The student participates in the sport of cheerleading only the previous year. The NMAA ruled eligible immediately for varsity athletic participation in all other sports except for cheerleading.

Bylaw 6.5.2

Belen High School- junior transfer student to Belen High School petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school and is currently academically ineligible. The NMAA denied varsity eligibility for 90 school days from the date of enrollment. The student is eligible for sub-varsity participation once all academic eligibility requirements have been met.

Capitan High School- freshman transfer student to Capitan High School petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied varsity eligibility for 90 school days from the date of enrollment. The student is eligible for sub-varsity participation.

Cibola High School- junior transfer student to Cibola High School petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied varsity eligibility for 90 school days from the date of enrollment. The student is eligible for sub-varsity participation.

Tohatchi High School- freshman transfer student Tohatchi High School petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended an out of state school and attended Tohatchi as an eighth grader. The NMAA denied varsity eligibility for 90 school days from the date of enrollment. The student is eligible for sub-varsity participation.

Valley High School- senior transfer student to Valley High School petitioning the transfer rule. The student previously attended another member school. The NMAA denied varsity eligibility for 90 school days from the date of enrollment. As a senior, the student is ineligible for sub-varsity participation.

Bylaw 6.3.4

Tohajiilee High School- junior transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended another boarding school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity eligibility for 90-school days.

Tohajiilee High School- freshman transfer student requesting varsity eligibility who previously attended another boarding school. The NMAA ruled ineligible for varsity eligibility for 90-school days.

Bylaw 6.5.3

Artesia High School- sophomore transfer student to Artesia High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Artesia High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Artesia High School.

Belen High School- junior transfer student to Belen High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Belen High attendance area. The NMAA rules immediate varsity eligibility at Belen High School.

Artesia High School- junior transfer student to Artesia High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Artesia High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Artesia High School.

Kirtland Central High School- junior transfer student to Kirtland Central High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Kirtland Central High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Kirtland Central High School.

Los Alamos High School- sophomore transfer student to Los Alamos High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Los Alamos High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Los Alamos High School.

Las Cruces High School- junior transfer student to Las Cruces High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Las Cruces High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Las Cruces High School.

Rio Rancho High School- junior transfer student to Rio Rancho High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Rio Rancho High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Rio Rancho High School.

Rio Rancho High School- sophomore transfer student to Rio Rancho High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Rio Rancho High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Rio Rancho High School.

Gallup High School- junior transfer student to Gallup High School. The student and family relocated and established a permanent residence within the Gallup High attendance area. The NMAA ruled immediate varsity eligibility at Gallup High School in all sports except in the sport of basketball, as the student participated at the previous school in the sport of basketball during the 2009-2010 school year.

Bylaw 6.9.1

Los Lunas High School- fifth year senior. The student exhausted their athletic eligibility. The NMAA ruled ineligible for all athletic participation for the 2009-2010 school year.

Bylaw 6.4.3

San Jon High School- two students with court ordered documentation. The NMAA granted immediate varsity eligibility at San Jon High School.
