- Keynote Speaker's Presentation Mike Pereira, FOX NFL & College Football Rules Analyst



Mike Pereira previously served as the Vice President of NFL Officiating and joined FOX Sports in 2010 in the unique position of a multi-platform NFL and college football rules analyst. He retired from the NFL in 2009 after 14 years with the league.

Mike has been involved in football since 1982 when he was an NCAA Division I official. He spent 14 years officiating college football, beginning with nine years in the Big West Conference, followed by five years in the Western Athletic Conference. During that time, he officiated eight postseason Bowl Games, including the Aloha Bowl, Cotton Bowl, Citrus Bowl, Gator Bow, Holiday Bowl, and Freedom Bowl. Pereira made the jump to the NFL as a sideline judge in 1996 while also holding the title of Supervisor of Officials for the WAC. After two years, Pereira was promoted to NFL Supervisor of Officiating in 1998. In 2001, he became Director of Officiating for the NFL and then was promoted to Vice President of NFL Officiating in 2004.

In February of 2017, Pereira launched "Battlefields to Ballfields", his foundation that provides scholarships to veterans of the United States Armed Forces.

Born and raised in Stockton, Calif., he graduated from Santa Clara University in 1972 with a B.A. in finance. Mike currently lives in Sacramento with his wife Gail.






John Hartog has been a member of the NMOA for over 40 years. During his 4 decade tenure with the NMOA, John worked out of the Gallup Associations in five sports—basketball for 41 years, soccer for 20 years, softball for 30 years, baseball for 5 years, and volleyball for 43 years. John serves as a local association president and a regional assignor in the sports of basketball, soccer, softball, and volleyball. John has served on several NMOA sport committees, and has been a trusted mentor, clinician, and instructor for officials in New Mexico

John has worked 17 NMAA State Basketball Championships and worked countless district tournaments in basketball and volleyball in addition to 14 State Volleyball Tournaments, 2 State Softball Tournaments, and 1 State Soccer Tournament. John was named the NFHS Volleyball Official of the Year in 2004, and in 2021 received the NFHS Section VI Active Official of the Year.

John and his wife Ruth will be celebrating their 54th wedding anniversary in August and have three children: Jeff, Jennifer, and Janelle and have six grandchildren: Mia, Hank, Anjali, Himani, Bella, and Bodie.



Dr. Ron Maestas has been involved with the NMOA for 54 years.. Ron has been selected to officiate in multiple state tournaments; wrestling (3), baseball (9), softball (16), and basketball (6) and has called at the college level in softball and wrestling.

Ron has received the NFHS Wrestling Official of the Year award in 2011, named the New Mexico Highlands University Professor of the year in 2020, and received the National Wrestling Coaches Association Dan Gable America Needs Wrestling Award in 2006.

Ron is a member of the New Mexico Sports Hall of Fame, New Mexico Wrestling Hall of Fame New Mexico Highlands University Hall of Honor, Adams State School of Education Hall of Fame, NAIA Cross Country Hall of Fame, and the California Hispanic Sports and Athletic Foundation Hall of Fame.

Ron and his wife Monica have three children; Lisa, Raymond, and Dominic, and two granddaughters; Lauren and Amanda who both were exceptional cross-country runners.



Oscar Payen began his career with the NMOA 40 years ago in 1982. In his first year with the NMOA Oscar registered for football, volleyball, basketball, baseball, and track & field, and had another 10 years committed in the State of Texas making this his 50th year as an official. Oscar has served in the position of president and vice president of the NMOA and a member on several NMAA committees. Oscar has represented the Southwest in several championships in basketball, football, and track & field and has also represented the NMOA as a regional assignor in basketball, football, and track.

Oscar has been recognized as an NFHS Track and Field Official of the year in 2012-13 and received the NMAA Distinguished service award in 2012. Oscar has served as official in the WAC, Big West, and 14 years in the RMAC and Western Junior College Athletic Conference. Oscar has made many friends and acquaintances with officials and coaches across Texas and New Mexico. Oscar donates his time to serve as an official in the Special Olympics Basketball Tournament and as a track starter at the Fabens, Texas Cotton Relays.



Dana Pappas began working at the NMAA as an administrative assistant for boys' sports and officials in 1997. After seven years as an administrative assistant, Dana was promoted to the Commissioner of Officials in 2004 and proudly served in that capacity until July 31, 2021 making her one of the longest tenured Commissioner of Officials in the country. Dana became the first New Mexican to receive the NFHS Citation for Officials and was also the first New Mexican to be named to the Board of Directors for the National Association of Sports Officials (NASO).

Dana now assumes the role of Director of Officiating Services for the NFHS in Indianapolis, Indiana. In addition to her role at the NFHS, Dana has also been named the Chairperson of the Board of Directors for NASO for the 2022-2023 school year.

Dana and her husband Ed have been married for four years and currently reside in Lebanon, Indiana. Her parents Tom and Jane Pappas, and her older sister, Michele, became a part of the NMOA family over the years through their assistance at the State Clinic and other Association events.
