

2017 Rio Rancho Convention and Visitors Bureau State Choir Contest



April 7-8, 2017 – V. Sue Cleveland High School Rio Rancho, New Mexico

Guidelines

Eligibility:

- 1. The NMAA Choir Contest is open to all NMAA Member High Schools and Junior High/Middle Schools/Mid Highs. NMAA scholastic eligibility requirements must be adhered to by all participating members. All performers must be eligible student participants of the choir in which they are performing; adults are not permitted to perform (with the exception of one school recognized piano accompanist).
- Participating ensembles must have received a composite 1st or 2nd division rating in a recognized NMMEA district festival in the past year.
- **3.** Ensembles that received an average composite score of 30 or below in the previous year's state contest are automatically eligible for the contest.
- **4.** All ensembles must participate in their most recent district MPA prior to the State Contest in order to be eligible. If their district MPA occurs after the State Contest, the ensemble must be registered to participate in their district MPA. The NMAA/NMMEA officials may make exemptions. These situations will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Classifications:

- 1. New Classifications: There shall be six classes of performance: Junior High/Middle School/Mid High, and High School A-3A, 4A, 5A, 6A and a combined A-6A Treble Choir division. A school may enter a concert choir in its competitive class as well as a treble choir, with the understanding that students may only participate in ONE choir. The NMAA staff will check the eligibility rosters to verify that students are not participating on both the concert and treble choirs. Any violations will result in disqualification from the state contest.
- **2. NOTE:** Due to the addition of a treble choir category, there will no longer be the option of performing for comments only.
- **3.** Ensembles must compete in the same classification level in which their school declares athletic participation in Boys Basketball.

Performance Specifications:

- 1. Ensembles must adhere to a 20 minute time limit on stage (from step on to step off).
- **2.** Ensembles exceeding this time limit will be assessed a two (2) point penalty, taken from their final averaged competitive score.
- **3.** Each ensemble must meet the following performance requirements:
 - a. Three (3) pieces
 - b. All pieces must be memorized
 - c. One selection performed a cappella
 - d. One selection in a foreign language
- 4. Each ensemble shall provide three original copies of the selections they are performing. Any photocopying can only be done with permission of the publisher, and written documentation granting permission must be submitted as well. Measures must be numbered. If three original scores are not provided, the ensemble may perform but will not be adjudicated. If scores are provided but do not meet the requirements as stated, there will be a three (3) point deduction off of the final averaged competitive score.
- 5. A concert piano will be provided for use during warm-up and performance.
- **6.** Recorded accompaniment will not be permitted.

- **7.** Additional accompaniment is optional and limited to four instruments performed by eligible students from the same NMAA member school, provided it is written in the original score of the piece.
- **8.** Any and all commentary prior to, during, and after a performance shall be made by the contest Master of Ceremonies.
- **9.** Directors should prepare their musical selections with the understanding that this is a Choir Contest and is not meant to showcase the theatrical abilities of an ensemble.

Judges:

- 1. Judges will be selected to meet the following requirements.
 - a. Judges must be selected from the database of qualified judges compiled and maintained by the NSCBCAC, or upon recommendation from the NMAA Choral Advisory Council.
 - b. All three judges will be from out-of-state, if possible.
- **2.** Every effort will be made to secure judges who have not adjudicated the NMAA State Choir Contest for at least three years.
- **3.** Judges will complete a NMAA State Choir Contest Adjudication Form for each ensemble.
- 4. No verbal/recorded remarks will be made by the judges.

Trophies and Awards:

- 1.Ensembles will be rated and ranked (i.e. Superior 14-19, Excellent 20-30, Good 31-45, Fair 46-60,
Poor 61-70) according to the NMAA State Choir Contest scoring matrix.
- **2.** Trophies will be awarded for 1st place through 3rd place in all classifications, provided that the score is 30 or below.
- **3.** There shall be trophies in each of the following classifications according to the guidelines above:
 - a. HS Class A-3A
 - b. HS Class 4A
 - c. HS Class 5A
 - d. HS Class 6A
 - e. HS Class A-6A Treble Choir
 - f. Junior High/Middle School/Mid High

An NMAA Championship Banner and Championship medals will be presented to the High School State Champions (A-3A, 4A, 5A, 6A and A-6A Treble Choir).

- 4. To be eligible to win a Championship, an ensemble must receive an average score of 30 or below.
- 5. To be eligible to place in the top three ensembles in a classification, an ensemble must receive an average score of 30 or below.
- 6. Superior plaques will be awarded to ensembles that receive a Composite I rating.
- **7.** All ensembles will be given adjudication sheets and competing ensembles will be given a recap of overall scoring.
- 8. No State Championship trophy or banner will be awarded in the Junior High/Middle School/Mid High classification as per rule 9.8.3 in the NMAA Bylaws. However, the ensembles that wins first place in this division will be given a banner and trophy specific to non-high school ensembles.
- 9. In the event of a tie, there will be no tie breaker.

Participant Code of Conduct:

Each participant; student, director, chaperone, worker, etc., is expected to act in a mature and responsible manner while at the State Choir Contest.

Ensembles are subject to contest disqualification, by the NMAA and the NMMEA Executive Director, for nonadherence to the above stated policies and guidelines.

Please submit the following to the NMAA:

- 1. Completed and signed registration form *must include program.*
- 2. NMAA Verification of Eligibility Form and roster, signed by a school administrator.
- **3.** Check or PO (payable to NMAA) or CCD for \$200.00 per choir.
