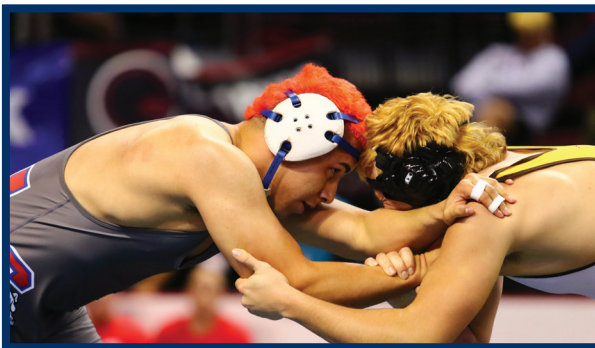

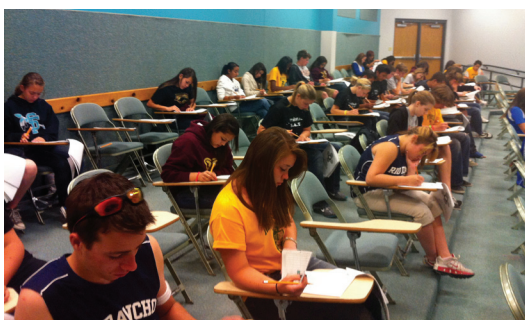


MISSION STATEMENT

The New Mexico Activities Association Foundation is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that was established in 2007 to support the many students that participate in high school athletic and activity programs across New Mexico. The funds raised by the Foundation are used for student scholarships and school grants/support.

ORGANIZATIONAL VISION

Enhance the opportunities for students to succeed through their participation in interscholastic athletics and activities, which are an integral part of the educational process.



Since 2007, over 200 students at more than 85 NMAA member schools have been awarded scholarships to attend the college or university of their choice. Unrestricted Gifts to the Foundation

Unrestricted gifts are deposited in to the general fund and used to support unnamed scholarships and the school grant/support program.

Restricted Gifts to the Foundation for Scholarships

Donors have the option of contributing to a "named scholarship." The minimum amount of a named donor scholarship is \$1,000 for a one year naming opportunity. A donor may also choose to establish a "perpetual scholarship" which is offered on an ongoing basis in the name of the donor.

\$1,000-\$2,499

GOLD

\$2,500-\$4,999

Same as above, plus state event tickets and hole sponsor sign at golf tournament.

PLATINUM

\$5,000-\$9,999

Same as above, plus ten fun run entries, one team in bowl-a-thon, and one team in golf tournament.

DIAMOND

\$10,000 and above

Same as above, plus ten additional fun run entries, one additional team in bowl-a-thon, and one additional team in golf tournament.

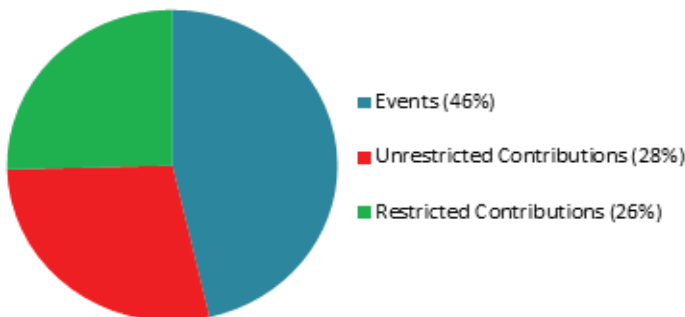

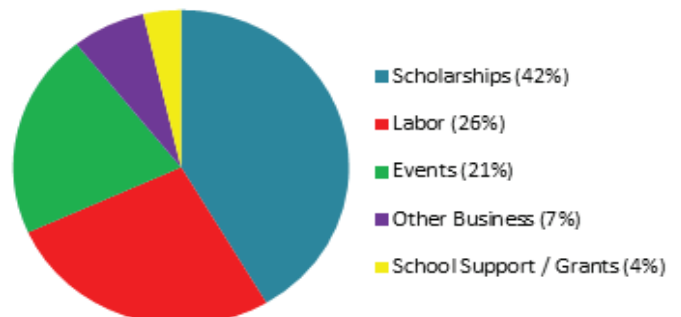
