NMAA Board of Directors' Meeting December 6, 2018 9:00 a.m. NMAA Hall of Pride and Honor

Welcome - Meeting called to order by Mr. T.J. Parks, NMAA Board of Directors President, at 9:00 a.m. Ms. Alissa Wesbrook, NMAA Assistant to the Executive Director, conducted roll call and the following members were present:

Ten members were present representing a quorum.

Approval of the Agenda:

Mr. Parks asked for a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Mr. Casados made the motion to approve the agenda. Ms. Dodd seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (10-0).

Approval of Minutes:

Mr. Parks asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the September 19, 2018 Board Meeting as presented. Ms. Dodd made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Ms. Viramontes seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (10-0).

Ms. Yvonne Garcia (Large School District I), representing Raquel Reedy, arrived at 9:05 a.m.

NMAA Executive Directors' Report:

Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, discussed (6) items on her report: 1) a recap of all NMAA Fall Championship Events (soccer, cross country, volleyball, and football); 2) an update on the financial reports & ticket sales for the Fall Championships; 3) a report on the current emphasis that has been placed on the Compete with Class sportsmanship initiative; 4) an update on the work of NMAA Sports Information Director J.P. Murrieta's to highlight high school athletics/activities; 5) a recap of the election results for the NMAA Board – she also thanked outgoing Board Member Jamie Widner (Small Area B) for his service; and 6) an update on the NMAA Hall of Fame and the recent selection of three individuals to be inducted as the Class of 2019 (Scott Affentranger, Don Gerheart, and Anthony Casados).

NMAA Activities Report:

Ms. Dana Pappas, NMAA Deputy Director, presented the activities report. She discussed four (4) items on her report: 1) a recap of State One Act Play and plan to review this activity/event moving forward; 2) an update regarding future Activity events, with most taking place between the months of February and April; 3) stated that the next NMAA Activities Council Meeting will take place in January; and 4) a report regarding the Student Advisory Leadership Committee and its fall meeting that was held in October.

New Mexico Officials Association Report:

Ms. Pappas presented the officials report. She discussed five (5) items on her report: 1) a report on officials' numbers for fall (football was down, volleyball & soccer were up) and winter (basketball, spirit, & wrestling are down, swimming is up) sports. 2) a recap of the office's decision to use a chain crew supervisor that is a registered official for all state football semifinals and finals 3) an update on the Fall & Winter Officials/Coaches Appreciation weeks 4) a recap of the Basketball/Wrestling Symposiums put on by the NMAA/NMOA and in conjunction with the NMHSCA; and 5) an update on the NMOA Baseball & Softball Clinics to be held in January.

General Discussion/Information Items:

NMOA: Varsity Assignors in All Sports - Ms. Pappas discussed the possibility of the NMAA office selecting Varsity Regional Assignors for officials in all sports. Currently there are varsity assignors in the sports of basketball and football only. This would help to increase the accountability of assignors and allow for more oversight of the process. It would result in an increase in expenses for the NMAA.

NMOA: Game Cancellation/Reschedule Policy - Ms. Pappas discussed a proposal for a formal cancellation/reschedule policy of games/events with regards to officials' payments. The proposal would include the home school informing the varsity regional assignor and the NMAA, in writing, at least 24 hrs. in advance of this cancellation unless unforeseen circumstances occur (weather, transportation etc.). The Athletic Director of the host school and the officials assigned are then expected to confirm the rescheduled games with one another at least three days in advance. If this process is not followed correctly, the school would be responsible for all official related fees.

Sports Medicine: Physicals and Consent to Treat - Mr. Scott Owen, NMAA Assistant Director, discussed the possible implementation of a blanket consent to treat form for all student athletes to sign prior to participation. In addition, this could be done in conjunction with a requirement for all students to use the same NMAA physical examination form. These recommendations are supported by the NMAA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee and received positive feedback from the Commission. The Board did have some questions regarding both the consent statement/form and physical form, but generally supported the proposal. The NMAA staff will collect more info on this topic and it may be added to a future agenda as an action item.

Basketball: Replay Update - Ms. Marquez discussed the potential use of replay in the sport of basketball. She reported that the NFHS states specifically what can and cannot be replayed and that if the membership would like to go in this direction, these rules would have to be followed for the NMAA to receive "100% state" status from the NFHS. The Board discussed technology and logistics for state tournament venues, the possible expansion of video from basketball to other sports, and the potential need to ensure accuracy if there is an opportunity to do so. Pros and cons were discussed, and Ms. Marquez stated that the replay committee will be consulted again and a potential action item may be placed on a future agenda.

Compete with Class Update - Ms. Marquez updated the Commission on the Compete with Class initiative. She stated that the fall did come with several incidents of concern, along with an increase in overall negative incidents in the sports of volleyball and football. She also stated that the membership, especially athletic directors and superintendents, have responded well to the emphasis on sportsmanship and that the NMAA will continue to work with all involved to promote the Compete with Class program.

NMAA Rules Clinics - Ms. Marquez asked for feedback regarding future Rules Clinics being held in person for all sports as opposed to the online versions currently used. The NMAA will continue to discuss this item internally and amongst the membership. The Board provided positive feedback in regards to the face to face contact being more beneficial and effective for coaches and officials. They did discuss the possibility of these in-person clinics being mandatory every other year or on some sort of rotational basis to help with travel costs.

State Championships Qualifiers - Ms. Marquez discussed the possible need for an adjustment to the number of state championship qualifiers in certain sports. In particular, 8-Man Football & Class A-3A Boys/Girls Soccer. Currently, the significant majority of the teams within these classifications make the playoffs, some with losing records. The Board agreed an adjustment could be beneficial and Ms. Marquez stated the staff will provide more information on this topic as the new classification & alignment block is discussed.

State Championships Seeding and Selection - Ms. Marquez asked for feedback in regards to the current seeding and selection process. She discussed some situations concerning tiebreaking procedures and the effect it had on the seeding/selection process for fall sports. Feedback from the Board was that the current process works well, but discussion with the membership should continue.

Action Items:

Reserve HS: Petition to Join 6-man Football District 2 - Ms. Missy Lengstorf, Athletic Director at Reserve High School, requested that Reserve be added to District 2 within 6-Man Football for the 2019 season. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept the proposal. No motion was made.

ATC: Petition to Join A-3A Boys Soccer District 1 - Mr. Tim Host, Athletic Director at the Academy for Technology and the Classics, requested that ATC be added to District 1 within Class A-3A Boys Soccer for the 2019 season. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept the proposal. No motion was made.

Basketball: Middle/Jr. High Start Dates: Ms. Marquez asked the Board to consider adjusting the start date for the Middle School / Junior High School basketball season from Monday of Week #21 to Monday of Week #19, noting that the split season start date would remain the same (Monday of Week #16). Mr. Parks asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Casados made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Viramontes seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (11-0).

Mr. Parks stated that Executive Session was not needed.

Forfeitures / Not Completing Schedules

3.11.4 A

Any school that, without just cause, withdraws its team from a contracted game, or does not pay a forfeiture fee that was due during the same season, may be disciplined or suspended by the Executive Director. Failure of a team to perform for a contracted contest between schools shall constitute a forfeit unless the two schools mutually agree to schedule the contest.

4.1.3.A

Schools that fail to complete seasons and/or fulfill contracts in any sport may be placed on probationary status in that sport and must petition the Director and the Board of Directors to be eligible for post-season play the succeeding year. Schools must fulfill financial obligations as set by the Director prior to having their status restored.

8th Grade Participation for Class 4A/5A

8th grade participation at the high school level has been a topic of conversation amongst the membership for several years. Although this allowance is important at the small school level, it can lead to inequities amongst larger schools (Class 4A/5A). The Commission discussed this item again at its February meeting and felt that dialogue should continue both at the Board level and amongst member schools.

Dear Sally:

The Albuquerque Public Schools (APS) is continuing the International Baccalaureate (IB) diploma program at Sandia High School (SHS) for 11th and 12th grade students in a very similar manner to which it was initiated at the beginning of the 2013-2014 school year. APS will continue to allow enrollment at SHS to this IB diploma program for 11th grade students across the district, without going through the district transfer process, upon meeting entrance requirements specific to the IB diploma program.

APS requests consideration to extend the current waiver of NMAA eligibility by-laws (6.4.1D and 6.6.1A) for these IB diploma program students and continue to allow immediate participation at all levels in athletics and activities at SHS providing all other eligibility requirements are met. This eligibility waiver would only apply to IB diploma program students enrolling at SHS prior to the first day of school; enrollment after the first day of school would continue to subject IB diploma program students to all NMAA transfer student regulations.

Sandia High School will ensure that students stay enrolled in the IB diploma program by submitting to the NMAA at each grading period (every semester) IB student's class schedules and grades for the remainder of their high school career in order to maintain their eligibility at Sandia High School.

APS requests the extension of this eligibility waiver for a time period of three (3) school years extending from the 2018-19 school year until the 2020-21 school year with a condition to review the accommodation, if approved, in the fall of 2020 for continued implementation or prior to that if circumstances regarding application to or enrollment in the IB diploma program significantly change.

Rationale: Currently, the Central Region Varsity Basketball assignor is paid \$5000 by the NMAA office to schedule officials for 43 schools (83 teams – 3 play only one gender). That averages out to \$60 per team. The above proposal gives assignors a pay increase to \$75 per team for varsity contests (25% raise). By using the 25% raise and rounding up, we get the amount for high-school sub-varsity and middle school.

The NMAA currently pays varsity regional assignors fees in basketball and football, totaling \$68,000.

To absorb the cost of the varsity assignors fees in all team sports, the total would be \$70,725 or an increase of \$2725.

Adding in swimming, track and wrestling is a little more difficult to figure.

Based upon the number of swimming and diving meets this year, the total for that sport would be \$4,080.

Based on the number of track and field qualifying meets last year, the total for that sport would be \$7,800.

Wrestling, if we went by number of schools, would be \$4,725.

Approximate budgetary impact to NMAA: \$19,330.00. This amount may fluctuate, if new programs come in.

PART A: In the event games are cancelled or rescheduled (dates or times), it is the home school's responsibility to inform the Varsity Regional Assignor or sub-varsity assignor and the NMAA, in writing, at least 24 hours in advance unless unforeseen circumstances occur (i.e., weather, facility, transportation issues). Failure to make this notification will result in the school being responsible for the payment of contest officials. This includes the game fee and mileage/meal/per diem, where applicable.

PART B: The AD, Athletic Coordinator or Athletic Secretary for the host school AND the officials assigned are expected to confirm scheduled games with one another approximately three days in advance of each contest.

Rationale:

There is currently no written provision in the NMAA By-Laws that covers this incident and it seems to recur more often now than in years past. With the shortage of officials, we need to make sure we do not have officials assigned to games that do not exist so they can be given a different assignment.

Budget Impact:

Possible increase to schools, if they fail to notify officials of game changes.



Amend bylaw 9.3.R to clarify that students who transfer to follow a coach at the middle school level will be ineligible for high school participation for both the 8th and 9th grade school years. (Erased language is stricken. New language is underlined.)

R. Student Transferring to Follow a Coach

The transfer/residency requirement is implemented as a means to discourage recruitment and reduce the opportunity for undue influence. Beginning with the summer prior to the 7th grade, if a student participates on a non-school team (i.e. AAU, American Legion, club settings, summer program, etc.) that is affiliated with or coached by a coach associated with that same sport at a school other than the one the Student attends or has attended, and then transfers to that school, regardless of change in bona fide residence, it will be assumed that the Student has been recruited to attend that school or transferred to that school for athletic reasons, and the Student will be ineligible for all high school athletic participation for 180 school days/365 calendar days both the 8th and 9th grade school years. If the Student transfers to a school that his/her coach has relocated to, regardless of change in the Student's bona fide residence, it will be assumed that the Student transferred to that school for athletic reasons and he/she will be ineligible there for all high school athletic participation for 180 school days/365 calendar days both the 8th and 9th grade school years.

Rationale:

Students who follow a coach while in middle school can currently sit their 180/365 penalty at the 8th grade level by making their 8th grade open enrollment choice thus retaining four years of varsity eligibility. This has become a loophole for schools who allow 8th grade participation and has not helped deter students from following a coach, it is just happening earlier.

The intent of the rule has always been to rule students who follow a coach ineligible for a year once officially enrolled in high school. The intent was not to allow them to circumvent the penalty by sitting out as an 8th grader. This proposal clarifies the original intent.
