Classification and Alignment - Mr. Parks asked that the board members take action on the appeals heard before Executive Session.

Cloudcroft High School - Mr. Casados made a motion to approve Cloudcroft High School's placement within the 8-Man football classification for the 2020-2022 block, but as an independent program with no post-season eligibility. Mr. Montano seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (12-0).

Dulce High School - Mr. Casados made a motion to approve Dulce High School's placement within the 8-Man football classification for the 2020-2022 block, but as an independent program with no post-season eligibility. Dr. Trujillo seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (12-0).

Gadsden Independent Schools - Mr. Casados made a motion to deny the appeal from Gadsden Independent Schools for Chaparral High School and Gadsden High School. Ms. Dodd seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed (9-2, Mr. Dempsey abstained).

Hatch Valley High School - No action was taken. Mr. Parks recommended that the NMAA staff meet with the Class A-3A girls' soccer athletic directors to discuss options and finalize alignment prior to the upcoming winter break.

House High School - Mr. Casados made a motion to approve the appeal from House High School regarding alternative program enrollment numbers. Mr. Viramontes seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed (11-0, Mr. Moyer abstained).

Santa Fe Prep - Ms. Sanders made a motion to deny the appeal from Santa Fe Prep. Ms. Dodd seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (12-0).

Santa Fe Prep / Monte del Sol Charter - Dr. Trujillo made a motion to approve the request from Santa Fe Prep and Monte del Sol to participate as a co-op in the sport of baseball as an independent program with no post-season eligibility. Mr. Dempsey seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (12-0).

Mr. Parks left the meeting leaving 11 members present.

### Action Items:

Consider final Approval of C & A for the 2020-2022 block - Mr. Casados asked for a motion to approve the proposed Classification & Alignment for the 2020-2022 block with changes made per appeals and adjustments as presented by NMAA staff. Mr. Lee made the motion to approve the proposal. Ms. Sanders seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (11-0).



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

Selection process for 12-team format in classes A/3A thru 5A in the sport of soccer, 2A thru 5A in the sport of football, and A thru 5A in the sport of volleyball.

Selection process for 8-team format in 8-man football

Selection process for 6-team format in 6-man football.

Selection process for 4-team format in class A baseball.

- **A.** District Champions will automatically advance to the playoffs. Exception: In the sport of basketball, if the regular season district champion and district tournament champion are different, they will both automatically advance to the playoffs.
- **B.** The remainder of the teams will be selected by the NMAA Staff using the following criteria. There is neither order nor priority in the criteria listed below:
  - Finish in regular season district play
  - Head to Head
  - Wins against district champions regardless of class
  - Overall Record
  - MaxPreps Freeman Rankings
  - Member School Input

Consider adjusting NMAA Football Bylaw 7.15.1.D so that individuals can participate in a maximum of 11 football games during the regular season. Varsity teams would still be limited to 10 total games (sub-varsity to 9 total games). \*for 8-Man & 2A-6A Classifications

### Rationale:

Individual athletes are currently limited to participation in a total of 10 football games during the regular season. The current definition of a "Football Game" as listed in the appendices of the NMAA Handbook is as follows:

For the purpose of determining the number of games played by an individual, a student-athlete is considered to have played a football game when he/she participates interscholastically in eight or less football experiences in a consecutive five-day period.

Because many schools schedule sub-varsity games during a varsity program's "bye week", athletes that "float" between teams may have to sit out this sub-varsity contest so that he/she does not violate the individual game limitation bylaws as set forth in the NMAA Handbook.

Proposal: Consider changes to NMAA Baseball Bylaw 7.12.1.D.1

\*changes in italics/underlined

At the varsity level, a pitcher may throw 120 pitches in <u>any three-day period</u>. At the sub-varsity level, a pitcher may throw 105 pitches in <u>any three-day period</u>. The pitcher will be allowed to finish a batter if they hit the maximum limit (120 in varsity, 105 in sub-varsity) during an at-bat, but must exit the game after the batter.

**Rationale:** Assist with player safety and the protection of young arms. The change limits the number of pitches an athlete can throw within a 3-day period. For example, current rules allow an individual to throw 60 pitches on Thursday and then come back and throw 120 pitches on Saturday (180 total) or 40 pitches on Friday and 120 pitches on Saturday (160 total). It is felt that this may be excessive and thus the baseball sports specific committee recommended a change.

**Timeline for Implementation:** Immediate for 2020 season. Although approval via a referenda vote is needed to amend the bylaw, it is requested that the NMAA Board of Directors implement this immediately as a temporary change until the administration of a referendum can occur (pursuant to Bylaw 2.7.4). This is due to the timing of the proposal in relation to the start of the baseball season.

Amend heat illness policy to be employed anytime school-sanctioned athletic activities occur, including competition.

Verbiage stricken is removed. Verbiage underlined is new.

### 7.6.21 Heat Illness Prevention Protocol

The athletic trainer and the head coach of each sport and level are responsible for checking the heat index prior to the beginning of practice any athletic activity. Go to the NMAA website (www.nmact.org) and enter your zip code and the site will calculate the heat index for the current time. You may also use the site to calculate for projected high temperatures. If the heat index is above 104, practice is cancelled. athletic activity must be postponed until Practice may occur later in the day provided the heat index falls to 104 or less. If the heat index is 100-104, consider modification modifying practices to remove protective equipment and to shorten practice duration. If the heat index is 95-99, use caution, but you may practice. If the heat index is under 95, the risk of heat illness is present, but the risk is greatly reduced. Water breaks should occur every 20-30 minutes during practice. Do not restrict the intake of fluids. Immersion in cold water is the treatment of choice for management of acute heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Call EMS if you suspect heat illness.

**Rationale:** Previous policy did not take into account competition, only practice. While practice reps/duration may exceed that experienced in competition, the risk for heat illness during competition is still present. The amended policy will ensure greater health and safety measures with respect to heat illness.

**Proposal:** Consider adjustment of NMAA Bylaw 7.17.1.J.1 – Remove the NOTE so that all state tournament soccer matches are limited to two ten-minute overtime periods.

Bylaw 7.17.1.J.1 Game Tie-Breaking Procedure - Regular season tournament games (at option of the host school) and all state tournament games

In games, when the score is tied at the end of regulation time, the referee instructs both teams to return to their respective team boxes. Coaches are allowed five minutes to confer with their teams. During this timeframe, the referee shall instruct both coaches as to proper procedure.

1. There shall be two ten (10) minute sudden victory overtime periods.

**NOTE:** In the final state championship games only, there shall be as many as four ten (10) minute sudden victory overtime periods.

a. A coin toss shall be held as indicated in the National Federation Soccer Rulebook.

**b.** At the end of each ten (10) minute sudden-victory overtime period, teams shall change ends.

Rationale: Soccer coaches feel that the possibility of four overtime periods in a state final is excessive.



### Proposal:

To revise current NMAA By-Law 7.13.2 which states: "Officials working NMAA sanctioned events must be registered through the Association. Schools are required to use two (2) NMAA/NMOA officials for NMAA regular-season sanctioned contests. Three (3) NMAA/NMOA officials may be used."

The new language would read: "Officials working NMAA sanctioned events must be registered through the Association. Schools are required to use three (3) NMAA/NMOA officials for NMAA regular-season sanctioned varsity contests. Two (2) officials may be used at the sub-varsity level."

### Rationale:

A number of schools in all classifications (especially 4A-5A) have opted to use only two officials during the 2019-2020 school year and the result has been complaints from the competing coaches (as well as spectators) and concerns from several administrators. Officials simply cannot manage the physicality of the game at the Class 4A and 5A levels without a third official and this is becoming common at the Class A-3A level as well. Two-person officiating is antiquated and will result in negative "non-basketball" off-ball situations. The game and the players have evolved past two-person officiating.

### **Budgetary Impact:**

The additional budgetary impact would depend on the number of games a school hosts. If a school hosts 10 girls' varsity basketball games and 10 boys' varsity home games, the total budgetary impact would be \$1,400 per year (\$70 for each third official times 20 total games).

GOLF: IWANAMAKER

- **Current:** 7.16.1 J Cell phones Cell phones must be kept on SILENT on the golf course and can NOT be used to make phone calls, however, use of cell phones to take pictures is permitted as long as it is not a distraction to the golfers or holds up the pace of play. ALL phone conversations MUST be made at the clubhouse. Violators of this policy will be asked to leave the course. **Players may not use cell phones or other communication devices while playing.**
- Proposal: 7.16.1 J ... Players may not use cell phones or other communication devices while playing, except in the following circumstances:

1. Calling a coach or tournament official for a medical or other emergency

2. Inputting scores for live scoring or other scoring applications, such as iWanamaker

- a. When inputting scores, <u>ONE</u> person from each group, prior to the start of the round will be designated to input scores using their cell phone. Scores should be inputted following the completion of each hole at the next tee box before anyone in the group tees off to start the next hole. If at some point during the round the designated scorer for that group cannot continue to score due to ie: cell phone battery dies, etc., a new player within the group will take over and the tournament director should be notified of the change in scorers.
- **Rationale:** In the Spring of 2020, the Golf Sports Specific Committee is requesting that schools pilot the iWanamaker scoring system in order to see if iWanamaker could be used for state qualification in the 2020-21 school year. Cell phones are needed by the student-athletes in order to use the iWanamaker scoring system. Schools or tournament directors would contact the NMAA in order to request a waiver of the local rule to use cell phones. Those schools would then be considered a 'pilot' school for iWanamaker. The NMAA would request information and feedback from coaches, administrators and spectators.

Require students who transfer out of a public school into a charter, alternative or non-member private school setting, during the semester, to be scholastically eligible at the time of their disenrollment in order to maintain scholastic eligibility.

The following language would be added to section 10 of the NMAA handbook for Charter, Alternative and Non-Member Private schools. This language mirrors the language for home schools in Section 10.

"If an academically ineligible Student in good standing transfers from a public school in his/her attendance zone to a charter/alternative/non-member private school setting, the Student is considered academically ineligible for participation. Student may gain eligibility as per NMAA Bylaw 6.2.1."

**Rationale:** Prevents students who are failing from gaining scholastic eligibility by dis-enrolling late in the semester into a less stringent academic setting.

Clarify that foreign exchange students who return to a member school after completing a formal sanctioned CSIET program are ineligible for varsity participation for 180 school / 365 calendar days.

Underlined language is new

### 6.8.2 Foreign Students

### A. International Student Exchange Participant

Eligible immediately if the Student is participating in a formal program sanctioned through the Council on Standards for International Educational Travel (CSIET) and is not directly placed by the CSIET program. Directly placed foreign exchange students will be eligible at the subvarsity level only. Students who receive a foreign exchange waiver are eligible to participate in NMAA sanctioned athletic events for a period of one calendar school year. If they return for a second year to the host school or any other member school, they are ineligible to participate in NMAA sanctioned athletic events; this includes students who change their visa status.

### B. Foreign Students (non U.S. citizens)

Foreign Students who enter this country without their parents/legal guardians and enroll in a NMAA member high school without a formal sanctioned CSIET program, or who return to a member school after completing a formal sanctioned CSIET program, are ineligible for 180 school / 365 calendar days at the varsity level. A Foreign Student who enrolls during his/her senior year may not participate in NMAA sanctioned events. It is not permissible for foreign students to live with coaches, administrators, or school officials without U.S. court ordered legal guardianship (See Undue Influence, 6.1.3). Foreign Students residing at boarding schools are exempt from this rule.

**Note**: Foreign Students who enter NMAA member schools without their parents and/or Legal Guardians are not afforded an Open Enrollment Choice

**Rationale:** Clarification of this rule is necessary to reinforce the understanding that the foreign exchange experience is limited to one-year of varsity eligibility and that those students who choose to remain after that year will not be afforded continued eligibility.
