## Approval of Agenda:

## Approval of Minutes from February 13, 2013:

Mr. Johnson asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the February 13, 2013
Commission meeting as presented. Mr. Gerheart made a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. Tillman seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (15-0).

## Directors' Report:

Mr. Dusty Young, NMAA Associate Director, discussed four items during his report: (1) The success of the nine spring State Championship events where 60 State trophies were awarded to 43 schools; (2) He expressed gratitude to Rio Rancho Public Schools, Albuquerque Public Schools, and Albuquerque Academy for use of their facilities during the State Championship events; (3) Farmers Insurance Group has renewed their corporate
contract with the NMAA, as well as their annual contribution in the amount of $\$ 10,000$ for student scholarships; and (4) US Bank recently awarded \$15,000 to six NMAA member schools in their Rally 4 Rewards program.

Mr. Bill Cleland, NMAA Associate Director, discussed two items during his report:
(1) MaxPreps Accessibility: Fall and Winter sports teams have been rolled over from the 2012-13 school year to the upcoming 2013-14 school year. Coaches / AD's may begin entering schedules for those teams onto MaxPreps for the 2013-14 school year, and (2) per NMAA bylaws, Commission Representatives should be elected on a 3 year rotation in equal numbers (i.e. 3 positions every year). However, this year there are four terms set to expire. An adjustment will need to be made to the expiration date of one Commission term in order to comply with the bylaws.

Ms. Pappas also thanked Rio Rancho Public School band students, Cleveland High School theater students and the Cleveland High School staff for their assistance with the Show Choir and Band Championships. She also discussed the upcoming Rodeo Championships which will be held June 5-9, 2013 in Lovington, New Mexico.

## New Mexico Officials Association Report:

Ms. Dana Pappas, NMAA Deputy Director/Commissioner of Officials, discussed four items on her report: (1) Number of individuals registered with the NMOA increased from 1718 to 1760, however, registrations decreased from 2399 to 2317, showing that multi-sport officials are declining; (2) NMOA State Clinic will be held Saturday, July 27, 2013 at the Hyatt Regency Downtown in Albuquerque where they will be celebrating "60 Years of Great Calls"; (3) Basketball camps will be held in Pojoaque, Albuquerque and Las Cruces and are considering a proposal to require attendance at camps for state tournament eligibility; and (4) NASO Summit Theme has been developed for 2014, "A Whole New Ballgame: Safe, Secure and By the Rules."

## Sports Specific Action Items:

Change diving DD requirement for State meet and qualifying (Action Item): Mr. Bill Cleland, NMAA Associate Director, discussed a change to the DD requirement as stated in NMAA Bylaw 7.20.2.F, from 12.0 to 12.2 for boys and from 11.0 to 11.2 for girls. Mr. Cleland stated that since NMAA Bylaw 7.20.2.B requires the Sports Specific Committee to set the DD for diving, no action is required on the part of the Commission.

8-Man Football Change to 3 Districts (Action Item): Mr. Dusty Young, NMAA Associate Director, discussed a proposal to add a third district to 8 -man football to better balance the districts and to align 8-man football with 11-man Class A football, which will also have 11 teams participating in the 2013-14 school year. The rational is that with the addition of Alamo Navajo to 8 -man football, 8 -man schools should be split into 3 districts, the same number of districts as 11-man Class A football, which has the same number of teams competing. There would be no change to the number of teams qualifying for State (6), but there would be one more district champion. Mr. Martin made the motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Tillman seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (15-0).

## General Action Items:

Physical Fitness \& Participant Insurance for JROTC, Bowling, and Rodeo (Action Item) (Referendum Item): Mr. Dusty Young, NMAA Associate Director, asked the Commission to consider a proposal that would require JROTC, bowling, and rodeo participants to follow the same physical fitness and insurance regulations as listed for athletes in Sections 6.15 and 6.16 of the NMAA Handbook, which would be implemented for the 2013-2014 school year. The rational is that the activities of JROTC, bowling and rodeo all require participants to physically exert themselves in competition. Because of this, students participating in these activities should go through the same physical examination process as those students that participate in sports. Additionally, participation in each of these activities can result in injury and therefore students should be required to be covered by accident/injury insurance. Mr. Martin made the motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Gerheart seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (15-0).

Establishment of an NMAA transgender policy (Action Item) (Referendum Item): Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, discussed the need for the NMAA to adopt a policy in regards to transgender participation in athletic competition as recommended by the NFHS. Ms. Marquez presented New Jersey's Transgender Policy and read through other Association's policies. Discussion was opened to the committee for feedback on this issue. Mr. Barreras made the motion to accept the proposal as presented. Ms. Nelms seconded the motion. Following additional discussion the committee took a break from 10:20 to 10:30 a.m. Discussion resumed and a roll call vote was taken to accept the proposal as presented:

## General Discussion/Information Items:

Tennis: Determine District Champion/tie-breaking procedures: Mr. Kenny Barreras, Director, APS Athletics, discussed four issues needing to be addressed in regards to the Tennis State Championships: (1) How districts determine team championships, head-tohead versus end-of-season tournaments; (2) establishment of statewide team tiebreaker system; (3) a system of determining match/event limits such as the points system used in wrestling, and (4) the selection process of teams to advance to the state tournament.

Rules clinic discussion, online or face-to-face: Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, discussed the fact that after the 2012-2013 face-to-face basketball rules clinics that were conducted in various locations statewide, it was determined that the majority of issues arose within the Albuquerque area. The area of most concern is in the sport of soccer, having only one referee making all calls on the field. She would like research conducted to determine if more than one official on the field can make calls. She discussed the importance of the rules clinic where rule changes and points of emphasis are presented. She asked for feedback from the committee and the need for all coaches, including, assistants, JV, etc. to take the clinic.

Selection / Seeding discussion: Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, discussed the positive outcome of the current process and asked for feedback from the committee members.

NFHS electronic devices policy: Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, discussed the new policy adopted by the NFHS and answered questions concerning the policy.

Status of Classification and Alignment: Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, discussed the upcoming Board of Directors meeting which will be held on June 5, 2013 at which time issues related to the Board approved C4 proposal will be discussed.

AD's July/August meetings: Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, discussed the mandatory AD's meeting which will take place on July 30, 2013 and the ability to get credit for attendance by viewing the meeting online after-the-fact. This will help alleviate problems concerning attendance for the mandatory NMAA meeting. The Rookie AD's meeting will still take place in August.

Foundation Golf: Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, reminded the committee members of the upcoming NMAA Foundation Golf Classic that will be held on June 3, 2013 at the Tanoan Golf Course.

## Consider Adjournment:

Mr. Johnson thanked all committee members for their dedication to the Commission and asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 11:55 a.m. A motion was made by Mr . Barreras. Mr. Haston seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (15-0).

Proposal: Standardize the match scoring for all district regular season and district tournament matches, as follows: best two-of-three tie-breaker sets, with ad scoring and a 7-point tie-breaker at 6 -all in each set. All team matches will utilize a 9-point format (6singles and 3-doubles matches) and will be played out to the full nine points.

For postponed or suspended matches due to darkness, weather or other conditions, refer to NMAA Handbook Sections 7.9 and 7.10. For district team matches if it is determined that a match cannot be continued it shall be rescheduled and continued from the point of interruption. Rescheduling of a suspended match shall be by mutual agreement. If agreement cannot be reached the NMAA director of tennis will determine a date and time for the rescheduled match.

Rationale: Standardizing match formats throughout all districts statewide provides consistency for the sport of tennis in qualifying players and teams to the state tournament.

Proposal: Tennis By-Laws (7.21—District Tournament: Team Champion).
In tennis districts, where the district team champion is determined based on the results of head-to-head matches against all other district teams, establish a statewide district formula for breaking ties in team placement.

Rationale: Establishes a standard system statewide that is based on both USTA principles and NMAA tie-breaker rules in other sports, thereby creating consistency amongst districts for state qualifying purposes.

Budget Impact: None

NMAA Staff Recommendation: Approve

Attachments: District Team Tie-breaker
I. Tennis District Team Tie-Breaker Format Proposal-to be utilized in tennis districts where district champion/runner-up is determined based on head-tohead dual matches.
A. In the case of a two-team tie, the team that defeated the other in head-tohead district play will earn the higher placement
B. In the event that more than two teams tie, placement is determined by a point system based upon the following:

1. Compare the results of head to head competition between the tied teams. If one team has defeated the other two teams, that team has earned the higher placement; the remaining two teams are placed based on the result of their head-to-head dual match;
.... if more than two teams are still tied then
2. the winner of the most individual singles/doubles matches, utilizing the 6-3 format in all matches between the tied teams, determines the placement order. In the event of a two-way tie for most matches won, the team which defeated the other in the district head-to-head match will earn the higher placement.

Example 1
School A: defeats school B 7-2; loses to school C 4-5= 11
School B: loses to school A 2-7; defeats school C 7-2=9
School C: defeats school A 5-4; loses to school B 2-7=7 Result: School C is third place. School B is second place. School A is district champion.

Example 2
School A: defeats school B 6-3; loses to school C 4-5= 10
School B: loses to school A 3-6, defeats school C 7-2= 10
School C: defeats school A 5-4; loses to school B 2-7=7
Result: School C is third place. Schools A and B are tied in total matches won. School A is placed first and School B second based on the result of their head-to-head match.

## Example 3

School A: defeats school B 7-2; loses to school C 4-5= 11
School B: loses to school A 2-7; defeats school C 6-3= 8
School C: defeats school A 5-4; loses to school B 3-6=8
Results: School A is the district champion. School B places second because they defeated School C 6-3 in their head-tohead dual match.
.... if more than two teams are still tied then
3. the team losing the fewest number of sets in matches between the tied teams determines the placement order. In the event of a twoway tie for fewest number of sets lost, the team which has defeated the other in the district head-to-head match will earn the higher placement.

## Example 1

Schools A, B and C each finish the district season with 3-1 records. Each schools district loss is to one of the tied teams. All matches amongst tied teams were by a 5-4 score, so tiebreaker \#2 (total matches won) yields a 3-way tie (9 matches won \& 9 lost by each school). Applying tiebreaker \#3 (fewest sets lost), Team A lost 18 sets in their 18 total matches. Teams B and C each lost a total of 20 sets in their 18 matches.
Result: Team A is placed $1^{\text {st }}$ based on fewest lost sets. Teams B and C are tied with 20 sets lost. Team C defeated Team B 5-4 in their head-to-head match. Team C is placed $2^{\text {nd }}$ and Team B $3^{\text {rd }}$ in the final district standings.
.... if more than two teams are still tied, then
4. the team losing the fewest number of games in matches between the tied teams determines the placement order. In the event of a two-way tie for fewest number of games lost, the team which has defeated the other in the district head-to-head district match will earn the higher placement.
.... if more than two teams are still tied then
5. a coin toss will determine placement, as follows.
a. All 3 teams flip a coin
b. The "odd man out" is the third place team
c. First and second place is then determined by which team defeated the other in their district head-to-head match.

Proposal: Require that all state qualifying track and field meets be timed using a Fully Automatic Timing (FAT) system. This requirement would begin with the 2015 track and field season.

Rationale: By requiring that state qualifying track and field meets use (FAT) timing, it ensures that all times submitted are accurate for seeding purposes.

Budget Impact: For those wishing to host a state qualifying meet, FAT systems could be purchased by the school or athletic district that the school belongs to. There would be a cost associated with the implementation of (FAT) systems at locations that do not currently have them.

NMAA Staff Recommendation: Recommend that all state qualifying track and field meets be required to use (FAT) timing for running events.

The bylaw currently reads, "In all races except distance events, contestants qualify for the finals on the basis of time only."

Rationale: By eliminating the current bylaw it would allow the NMAA to use the NFHS preferred system that allows heat leaders and a designated number of the next fastest runners (dependent on the number of heats) to advance to the finals through head to head competition.
