NMAA Director's Report

Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, presented the NMAA Director's Report. She discussed three (3) items on her report. 1) mentioned current issues with social media and false information being presented regarding the 2020-2021 school year; 2) welcomed Mr. Scott Elder to the Board of Directors starting on June 1, 2020 (representing Albuquerque Public Schools / Large School District I); and 3) stated that the next regular Board of Director's Meeting is scheduled for September 16th and all meeting dates for 2020-2021 were now on the NMAA calendar.

NMAA Financial Report

Ms. Marquez presented the financial report. She discussed two (2) items on her report. 1) stated that the budget for 2020-2021 has yet to be finalized due to the current pandemic but will require Board approval at a future meeting; and 2) provided an overview of the organization's financial losses due to the fact that most of State Basketball was played without fans and Spirit and Spring Championships did not take place.

New Mexico Officials Association Report

Ms. Dana Pappas, NMAA Commissioner of Officials, presented the New Mexico Officials Association Report. She discussed one (1) item on her report: 1) reported that multiple educational webinars are taking place in seven different sports to help keep officials engaged and active even without games/events taking place.

Discussion/Information Items

Sports Medicine: Heat Illness - Mr. Scott Owen, NMAA Assistant Director, discussed the current Heat Illness Policy as it pertains to turf fields and stated that the NMAA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee recommended that no changes were needed at this time.

Wrestling: School Co-Ops - Mr. Owen discussed the possibility of school co-ops in the sport of wrestling due to limited participation numbers in Classes A-3A. This would help create more competitive and complete teams within the state's smallest classification. The group was open to the possibility but had concerns with how this might impact other individual sports.

Golf: Centralized State Championships - Ms. Marquez discussed the possibility of centralizing the Golf State Championships. In previous years, they have been held at three different sites; one north, one central and one south. Centralizing the event would help schools with travel costs/time in years when the tournament is held on the opposite side of the state, while also providing cost savings for the Association.

NMAA State Championship Trophies: Ms. Marquez stated that the current pandemic has led the NMAA to table the idea of creating a new state championship trophy. More information about a possible change will be brought to the Board during the 2020-2021 school year.

Bylaws Committee Work: Ms. Marquez provided an update on current discussions taking place with the Bylaws Committee which include possible changes in seeding and selection criteria, equitable opportunity data (free and reduced lunches) in terms of classification and alignment, and the return to play summer guidelines.

Mr. Parks reminded the group that the first five action items were now discussion items only.

Officials: Invitational Tournament - Ms. Pappas discussed pertaining to Guidelines for Hosting NMAA Invitational Tournaments, which would include a revision to Bylaw 7.8.9 so that it would read: "Officials used for regular season invitational tournaments in all sports must have their registration verified by the NMAA office, Regional Assignor or Local Assignor prior to their assignments to said tournaments." The guidelines would also state that fees cannot be negotiated at a higher or lower rate than what is on the NMAA Officials' Fee Schedule.

Track and Field: Certified Officials - Ms. Pappas discussed the need to revise a current NMAA track and field bylaw regarding qualifying meets requiring Certified Track and Field Meet Referees, assigned by an NMAA Varsity Regional Track and Field Assignor. This individual will certify/verify the results of the meet and will serve in all roles as outlined by the NFHS Track and Field Rulebook.

Football: Class 2A Calendar- Mr. Dusty Young, NMAA Associate Director, discussed a proposal to consider amending the calendar (Bylaw 7.15.6 - Playoff Weeks) for Class 2A Football so that brackets for the state tournament are released at the same time as Class 3A-6A (Saturday of Week #18). Currently, the Class 2A brackets are released on Saturday of Week #17.

Basketball: 2-Person Crews for Class 1A - Ms. Sally Marquez, discussed a proposal to amend the recently approved Bylaw 7.13.2.A (Basketball Officials) to read: "Officials working NMAA sanctioned events must be registered through the Association. Class 2A-5A schools are required to use three (3) NMAA/NMOA officials for NMAA regular-season sanctioned varsity contests. Two (2) officials may be used at the sub-varsity level. Class A schools are required to use a minimum of two (2) NMAA/NMOA officials for NMAA regular season sanctioned varsity contests."

NMPSIA Request: Coach Ed Requirement - Ms. Marquez discussed a proposal to, upon request from the New Mexico Public Schools Insurance Authority, consider approval of a requirement that all coaches review two free online courses (Bullying, Hazing, and Inappropriate Behaviors; and Protecting Students from Abuse) offered via the NFHSLearn website. She also referenced interest from the New Mexico High School Coaches Association in offering some of their professional development courses to meet this requirement.

Action Items

Physical Exams for 2020-2021 School Year – Due to the coronavirus pandemic and limited access to health care providers, Ms. Marquez presented a proposal for physical exams for the 2020-2021 school year to read: the 2019-2020 sports physical shall be accepted for the 2020-2021 school year if the following criteria are met over the time period since the student's 2019-2020 sport physical: The Student did not have any new injury; the Student did not receive a new medical diagnosis and a student has not had Covid-19. If any of the above criteria are not met, the Student must have an updated sports physical for 2020-2021. Students who did not receive a sports physical during 2019-2020 school year must also have an updated physical. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to approve the proposal as presented. Mr. Casados made the motion to approve the proposal. Mr. Carpenter seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken and passed unanimously (12-0).

ESPORTS: ADOPTION OF NMAA BYLAWS

- Presenter: Dusty Young, Associate Director
- Proposal: Consider adoption of NMAA bylaws for Esports.
- **Rationale:** Esports was approved as an NMAA sanctioned activity in June of 2018. The proposed bylaws reflect the current policies that have been in place for the past two seasons. The activity has seen substantial growth since its inception and the Esports community supports the addition of official NMAA rules/regulations to Section 8 of the Handbook.

NMAA Staff Recommendation: Approve

8.3 ESPORTS

8.3.1 Sportsmanship / Compete with Class

"Compete with Class" is a New Mexico sportsmanship program designed to help better understand the true value of interscholastic athletics and activities – to educate and prepare our youth for the future.

The NMAA defines sportsmanship as, "the act of treating others in a respectful manner; taking personal accountability for one's actions and responding with integrity while engaged in competition" and is rooted in three core values: Respect, Integrity and Responsibility.

Esports players and coaches will be held to these high standards, in addition to the codes of conduct and rules as set by game publishers and the NMAA's Esports provider.

Violations to any of these policies shall result in sanctions as determined by the NMAA Executive Director. Sanctions may include, but are not limited to, warnings, probation, suspensions, forfeitures, and/or fines.

A. Examples of Unsportsmanlike Actions

- 1. Smurf Account: Slang term used in online video games, wherein a fake account or profile is created by an experienced player to pose as an inexperienced one in order to gain an advantage. All players must use their highest level account when registering with PlayVS and when playing in any NMAA sanctioned Esports match. Potential violations should be reported to the NMAA.
- 2. Playing Under Another Student's Account: Player A is listed as a starter or substitute for a given match. Another individual then plays the match under this account. This is a form of deception and potential violations should be reported to the NMAA.

8.3.2 Scholastic Eligibility

All Esport Students must adhere to the same scholastic requirements set forth by the NMAA in Sections 6.2 and 8.1.1.

8.3.3 General Rules/Policies

A. Approved Games – The NMAA has sole authority to select which games will be offered and can amend this list at any time. No restricted categories, as defined as "ESRB M (Mature)" or above shall be used, marketed, and/or promoted by the NMAA nor its member schools.

*Note – For a complete list of approved games, see Section 8.3.5

B. Esports Management Platform – The NMAA has sole authority to determine the entity that will serve as the official Esports provider/platform for its official championship season and any other sanctioned events.

Q1: Can schools play on platforms outside of the NMAA's official Esports provider?

A1: Yes, but these matches/events would not be sanctioned and thus not under the NMAA Esports umbrella.

- C. Participation and Fees
 - 1. School Teams Member schools may have one varsity team for each game. They may also have an unlimited number of sub-varsity teams that can participate in regular season matches but are not eligible for the state playoffs.
 - 2. Declaration Date In order to be eligible to participate in the NMAA's championship season (Spring semester), schools must declare their intentions by the Friday of Week #25.

- 3. **Rosters** School rosters for varsity teams will be dependent on the game and will allow for starters and substitutes. Students can be moved from varsity and sub-varsity teams throughout each season but rosters for varsity matches must be set in accordance with platform provider guidelines.
- 4. Students / Multiple Games Although it is strongly encouraged that schools limit each student to participation in one game, a student may participate in multiple games if this helps fill a team due to limited numbers within a school's program.
- 5. Fees Schools will not be charged fees to participate in the activity of Esports. Students will be charged a participation fee to access the platform created and maintained by the NMAA's official Esports provider. These fees will be determined prior to the start of each school year.
- **D.** NMAA Coach/Sponsor Clinic The head coach/sponsor from each Esports school must complete the NMAA Rules Clinic. This will be offered online prior to the start of each championship season. Failure to comply shall result in a \$100 fine to the school.
- E. Classifications There are two classifications: A-4A and 5A.
- **F.** Official Season Although a Fall exhibition season may be offered by the NMAA, the official championship season will take place during the Spring semester.
 - 1. **Start Date** Practice and scrimmages may begin the Monday of Week #28. The season ends when a school is eliminated from or does not qualify for the postseason.
 - 2. Schedule / Matches Each school will play 13 matches at the Varsity level, beginning in Week #30. One match will be played each week during the regular season (unless reschedules require more than more than to be played during a week). Sub-varsity programs will play a maximum of 13 matches. The NMAA will work with its Esports provider to create a full schedule prior to the season. Matches will be scheduled at random with priority set for schools to compete within their own classification (if total school participants allow for this).

The NMAA's Esports provider will determine the format for each match, based on the game title being played (i.e. three games within each match, five games within each match, etc.).

3. **Reschedules / Forfeits** – Schools will follow the rescheduling and forfeit policies established by the NMAA's Esports provider. During extraordinary circumstances, the NMAA will work with its Esports provider and impacted schools to determine final rulings.

8.3.4 State Championship Information

- **A. Dates:** Week #43 and #44
- **B.** Format
 - 1. Classifications Two: A-4A and 5A.
 - 2. Varsity Competition Schools may have only one team designated as its Varsity program within each game title. Only the declared Varsity program is eligible for the postseason.
 - 3. Determination of Champions by Class There will be two Esports state champion schools: one in Class A-4A and one in Class 5A. The champion will be determined by participation and success in each game title offered by the NMAA. Points will be awarded based on participation, regular season finish, and state tournament finish within

each game title. Point distribution will be determined based on the number of participants in each game title/classification and set at the start of each season.

4. Brackets – Each game title will have a separate state tournament bracket for all classifications. Qualifiers will be determined by the NMAA's Esports provider and will be based on final regular season standings. The bracket size will be determined by the number of schools participating in each game title/classification as follows:

< 10 schools – 4 qualifiers 10-19 schools – 8 qualifiers > 20 schools – 16 qualifiers

- **5. Single Elimination** The state tournament will be single elimination. Exact game format will be determined by the NMAA's Esports provider based on each game title. This format may be different than that used during the regular season.
- 6. Trophies / Medals The NMAA will award State Championship trophies to the top three (3) teams in each classification (State Champion, State Runner-Up, State Third Place). The state champions will also receive team medals.

Participants from the top four (4) schools in each game title will receive individual medals, which reflect their school's finish during the state tournament.

8.3.5 Game Titles / Other Rules

- A. Only the following games have been approved by the NMAA as sanctioned Esports titles:
 - **1.** League of Legends
 - 2. Rocket League
 - 3. SMITE

B. Game Specific Information

Complete rules/regulations for gameplay will be determined by the NMAA's Esports provider, in conjunction with the game publisher for each title. These will be made available through the NMAA website.

*NOTE – Additional rules/policies adopted by the NMAA will supersede those set by the Esports provider and/or game publisher.

1. League of Legends

- a. Roster Size Five (5) starters and up to two (2) substitutes.
- b. Roles All players must be in their appropriate roles according to pick order: Top, Jungle, Mid, ADC, Support. If a player is selected as a Mid-role, they must log into the game in the appropriate pick order. For example: If a player is first pick (Top) and selects a Mid-role and plays that Mid-role, he/she is using deception to gain advantage. Players may pick a character for another role and swap characters, but if they are designated as a Top role, they must play that role. If a player wishes to move roles and move from Top to Mid for better match- ups, the opposing coach must be notified immediately before the match and a minimum of 15 minutes of extra time is given to that coach to allow for research if requested.
- 2. Rocket League
 - a. Roster Size Three (3) starters and up to two (2) substitutes.
- 3. SMITE
 - a. Roster Size Five (5) starters and up to two (2) substitutes.

b. Roles – All players must be in their appropriate roles according to pick order: Solo, Jungle, Mid, ADC, Support. If a player is selected as a Mid-role, he/she must log into the game in the appropriate pick order. For example: If a player is first pick (Solo) and selects a Mid-role and plays that Mid-role, he/she is using deception to gain an advantage. Players may pick a character for another role and swap characters, but if they are designated as a Solo role, they must play that role. If a player wishes to move roles and move from Solo to Mid for better match- ups, the opposing coach must be notified immediately before the match and a minimum of 15 minutes of extra time is given to that coach to allow for research if requested.

C. Other Rules

1. Rosters / Line-ups: Rosters and line-ups for each match must be finalized a minimum of 30-minutes prior to the start of each match. Any changes made after this deadline must be communicated directly to the opposing coach, who can then request a delay (maximum 15-minutes) to the start of the match to allow for research/preparation.

Proposal:

To revise a current NMAA track and field bylaw to reflect current assignment practices and procedures.

Current Bylaw:

M. Certified Officials

2. Meet referees may be coaches who are certified track officials via the NMAA / NMOA as long as there are at least THREE coaches from three different schools at three who are NMOA certified and all three must agree to certify/verify the results of the meet.

Proposed Revision:

Each qualifying meet is required to have a Certified Track and Field Meet Referee, assigned by an NMAA Varsity Regional Track and Field Assignor. This individual will certify/verify the results of the meet and will serve in all roles as outlined by the NFHS Track and Field Rulebook.

Rationale:

Now that the NMAA has an assignor system in track and field, this by-law is no longer necessary and defeats the purpose of having assignors. Schools can still use referees they have traditionally had at their meets, in communication with their assignor, but it is no longer efficient to have coaches serving as officials and is no longer necessary with the assignor system. In many cases, the coaches who were serving as meet referees were not following the process to register as track and field officials.



Proposal:

The new language recently passed by the membership:

"Officials working NMAA sanctioned events must be registered through the Association. Schools are required to use three (3) NMAA/NMOA officials for NMAA regular-season sanctioned varsity contests. Two (2) officials may be used at the sub-varsity level."

The new language proposed after recent referenda vote and discussion among member schools:

"Officials working NMAA sanctioned events must be registered through the Association. Class 3A-5A schools are required to use three (3) NMAA/NMOA officials for NMAA regular-season sanctioned varsity contests. Two (2) officials may be used at the sub-varsity level. Class A-2A schools are required to use a minimum of two (2) NMAA/NMOA officials for NMAA regular-season sanctioned varsity contests.

Rationale:

After review of the February/March referenda results pertaining to the requirement that all schools use three-person crews instead of two for varsity basketball games, it was found that Class A voted 12-3 against the proposal. Also, 2A schools have shown concerns with the change to three-person crews due to the budgetary implications that have resulted from the coronavirus pandemic and possibility that spectators may not be allowed at contests to help offset expenses.

Budgetary Impact:

Allowing Class A-2A schools to use two officials for both boys and girls games instead of three could potentially save schools \$1000+ depending on their schedules.

NMAA Staff Recommendation: Approve

NMAA Commission Recommendation: Approve (16-0) for Class 1A at May meeting. This item was placed on the agenda as a Discussion Item for the September meeting and the addition of 2A to the proposal was supported.

As you are aware the New Mexico Public Schools Insurance Authority has been struggling with an increase in the number of inappropriate behavior claims involving school employees, contractors and volunteers. Unfortunately a few of the claims have involved coaches. We would like to formally request that NMAA require two thirtyminute courses for all coaches in NM -Bullying, Hazing and Inappropriate Behaviors and Protecting Students from Abuse currently available for free on the NFHS Learn site. Both programs, although slightly different, address the need for coaches to be aware of the signs and impact of child abuse, as well as, the diligence required by coaches to recognize and report potential abuse. The Bullying, Hazing and Inappropriate Behaviors addresses responsibilities of individual coaches, whereas the Protecting Students from Abuse does an excellent job of helping individuals recognize child abuse and the reporting requirements.

Thanks for the email. We would like to make an additional action item or amendment to the "(A) NMPSIA Request: Bullying/Hazing Coach Ed Course" to include the NMHSCA's *"Protect Your Athletes, Protect Your Staff, & Protect Yourself" training as a method in which to meet a NMAA mandate of additional educational courses.* This particular NMHSCA course is a focus on legal duties and ethical expectations of all coaches with a specific focus in the areas of: Cyber bullying, hazing, physical/mental abuse, sexual harassment/assault, difficult parents and building team cultures. It is aligned with the most recent peer reviewed academic principles of coaching in conjunction with the experience and history of the NMHSCA to help coaches be better coaches. This course was most recently presented at the NMTCCCA annual clinic in January, 2020 as well as the core elements of a Coaching Principles course I taught at UNM this semester. The course will also be updated annually to reflect on the most recent history of NM sports. Truth be told, I took the NFHS online class just to ensure I wasn't missing anything from our research.

The NMHSCA & NMAA had a similar arrangement with the ASEP's Coaching Principles course previously. The idea was a collaboration between Dan Salzwedel and Bobby Gibbs, and I believe it was a super beneficial mechanism for helping coaches be better coaches.



1. Annual Meeting – 2.5.1

a. There will not be an Annual Meeting (Fall Conference) requirement for the 2020-2021 school year.

2. District Clinics (All conducted via Zoom except for Spirit) - 3.6

- Cross Country, Golf, Volleyball September 28
- Spirit October 17
- Basketball, Swimming & Diving December 28
- Soccer February 8
- Football February 16
- Golf, Tennis, Track & Field March 29
- Baseball, Softball March 30
- Wrestling April 6

3. School Online Reporting – NMAA Bylaw 3.9

- a. Beginning of School Information 3.9.2
 - i. No change to current NMAA policy. Each member school must submit/update their school information through Max Preps by September 1.

b. Beginning of Athletic Season Information (Max Preps Deadlines) - 3.9.3

- Cross Country, Golf, Volleyball October 16
- Basketball, Swimming & Diving January 15
- Soccer February 26
- Football March 12
- Spirit March 19
- Baseball, Golf, Softball, Tennis, Track & Field April 16
- Wrestling April 23

c. Pre-Season Meetings – 3.9.4

i. There are no pre-season meeting requirements for the 2020-2021 school year however; schools will need to provide the NMAA Pre-Season video to all parents and students.

4. Failure to Complete Season and Classification & Alignment – NMAA Bylaw 4.1.3.A

- a. Schools opting to drop a sport must notify the NMAA at least two weeks prior to the start of official practice for that sport.
- b. Schools unable to start or complete seasons due to state, county, or local health department or local school/school district determinations will be exempt from penalties for failure to complete seasons and/or fulfill contracts.
- c. Classification and alignment by sport will be updated throughout 2020-2021 to account for schools that will not have programs due to the extraordinary circumstances surrounding the pandemic.

5. Scholastic Eligibility – NMAA Bylaw 6.2

- a. A Student may compete without reference to his/her immediate or previous scholastic record (Spring Semester, 2020). The end of the 1st grading period (6 or 9 weeks) is the beginning of the scholarship requirement (2.0 with no F's) for Students.
- b. A Student who is scholastically eligible at the end of the 1st semester of the 2020-2021 school year shall remain eligible for the remainder of the 2020-2021 competition calendar.
- c. A Student who is scholastically ineligible after the 1st semester of the 2020-2021 year, and is unable to utilize the cumulative provision, is subject to the following guidelines for regaining and retaining eligibility for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year:
 - i. A Student may regain his/her eligibility at the next regular grading period (3rd quarter or 4th 6-weeks).
 - ii. A Student who regains eligibility at the 3rd quarter will retain his/her eligibility for the remainder of the 2020-2021 competition calendar.
 - iii. A Student on a 6-week grading period who regains/maintains eligibility after the 5th 6-weeks will retain his/her eligibility for the remainder of the 2020-2021 competition calendar.
 - iv. A Student who is ineligible at the conclusion of the 3rd quarter or 5th 6-weeks, will remain ineligible for the remainder of the 2020-2021 competition calendar.
- d. Spring 2021 semester grades determine scholastic eligibility for the Fall 2021 semester.

6. Multiple Seasons in Same Sport – NMAA Bylaw 6.5.1.C.1, 6.13.1.B

a. No changes to current NMAA policy.

7. Transfer Students – NMAA Bylaw 6.6

a. No changes to current NMAA policy.

8. Did Not Participate Exception – NMAA Bylaw 6.9.2.B

a. If a school is unable to offer a particular sport during the 2020-2021 school year due to state, county, or local health department or local school/school district determinations, students who later transfer from those schools will have their 2019-2020 sport participation utilized when applying the did not participate exception.

9. Semesters of Attendance – NMAA Bylaw 6.12

a. No changes to current NMAA policy.

10. Physical Exam Waivers – NMAA Bylaw 6.15

- a. Students who received a sports physical on or after April 1, 2019 may utilize the NMAA Returning Athlete Physical form if approved by the local school/district.
- b. Students who have not had a physical exam on or after April 1, 2019 must receive a formal sports physical utilizing the NMAA Required Physical Form.

11. Out-of-Season Coaching - NMAA Bylaw 7.4, 9.7.8

- a. High school out-of-season coaching regulations will remain in effect as per Bylaw 7.4 in the NMAA Handbook.
- b. Middle school students/coaches will be permitted out-of-season contact time, exclusive of the high school, but must follow the out-of-season coaching regulations listed in Bylaw 7.4 of the NMAA Handbook.
- c. Summer regulations will go into effect Memorial weekend.

12. Minimum Contests for Post-Season Eligibility – NMAA Bylaw 7.6.5

- a. Not in effect for the 2020-2021 school year.
- b. Schools will still be required to meet district competition requirements.

13. Missed Games – NMAA Bylaw 7.9 (See also 3.11.4, 5.1.6 & 5.1.7)

- a. Teams will not be penalized a loss or forfeit due to state, county, or local health department determinations relative to Covid-19.
- b. Games missed due to Covid-19 will be considered a "no contest" but can be made up if mutually agreed upon.
- c. Teams may work to reschedule with new possible opponents should they have open dates due to scheduled opponents missing games.
- d. District games missed due to Covid-19 must be rescheduled if time permits (see Rule 16 below). Teams may work to reschedule with new possible opponents if the district game(s) cannot be rescheduled.

14. Out-of-State Competition

a. Out-of-State competition is permitted but schools must comply with public health orders, including potential quarantine orders.

15. Home/Charter/Alternative/Non-Member Private School Eligibility – NMAA Section 10

- a. No changes to current NMAA policies.
- b. Students electing to remain enrolled through virtual curriculum offered by the local public school, retain eligibility at that school.

16. Seeding & Selection Rules – NMAA Bylaw 7.11

a. Qualifying Numbers

- i. 8-Team Format
 - Baseball (2A-5A), Basketball (A-5A), Football (6-man, 2A-6A), Soccer (A/3A-5A), Softball (A/2A-5A), Volleyball (A-5A)
- ii. 4-Team Format
 - Baseball (A), Football (8-man)

b. Seeding & Selection

- District Champions will automatically qualify for the State Championships.
- At-large teams will be selected using the standard criteria listed in Section 7.11.2.B of the Handbook.
- A school forced to cancel one or more district games due to state, county, or local health department determinations, must complete at least 51% of their district schedule to be eligible for post-season selection. This rule only applies to those schools forced to shut down due to state, county, or local health department determinations.
- District finish will be determined using the win/loss percentage of district games played.
- District ties will be broken using the sport specific procedures listed in Section 7 of the Handbook.
- District tie-breaking games will not occur in the sport of basketball.
- State seeding will utilize the standard criteria listed in section 7.11.3 of the Handbook.

17. Powerlifting

a. Powerlifting will be added as a sanctioned activity for the 2020-2021 school year.
