

#### **NMAA Executive Directors' Report**

Ms. Sally Marquez, NMAA Executive Director, discussed three (3) items on her report: 1) The success of the 2015-2016 school year, with attendance up in every sport except football; 2) sportsmanship was great this year, the kids are definitely Competing with Class; and 3) special thanks to both the NMAA staff and NMAA Board on a great and successful year.

#### **Financial Report:**

Ms. Shari Kessler-Schwaner, NMAA Business Manager, presented the NMAA Finance Report for the 2015-2016 school year.

#### **Finance Action Item:**

2016-2017 NMAA Budget: Ms. Marquez asked the Board to approve the 2016-2017 NMAA budget as presented. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept the proposed NMAA budget for the 2016-2017 school year with an amendment to the budget to increase the Executive Directors' salary by \$10,000. Mr. Green made a motion to accept the proposed budget with the amendment. Mr. Widner seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (11-0).

#### **NMAA Activities Report:**

Ms. Dana Pappas, NMAA Deputy Director, discussed two (2) items on her activities report: 1) Increase in participation in all activities for the 2015-2016 school year; and 2) the status of the Student Leadership Advisory Council.

#### **General Discussion / Information Items:**

8<sup>th</sup> grade participation at high school: Ms. Marquez and Board members discussed the pros and cons of allowing 8<sup>th</sup> grade participation at the 4A-6A classification level. In the 1A-3A classifications, not

allowing 8<sup>th</sup> grade students to participate at the high school level could hurt certain sports and teams because they may not be able to field a full team. At the 4A-6A classification, 8<sup>th</sup> grade students could be displacing high school students on a team. Allowing 8<sup>th</sup> grade students to participate at the high school level is a decision that is currently left up to local schools/districts.

Non-member private school participation: Ms. Marquez stated that currently, non-member private schools are not allowed to participate with or against NMAA member schools. She asked Board members if the NMAA should consider creating a bylaw to allow students attending a non-member private school to participate in sports at their home attendance school, just as home school and charter school students are allowed to do.

New sports/activities: Ms. Marquez discussed the current bylaw that requires at least 10% of NMAA member schools, which is currently 16 schools, to participate before adding a new sport/activity. With various activities looking for NMAA sanctioning, Ms. Marquez wanted to know if the Board was still in favor of this threshold.

Remove sanctioning of Rodeo: Ms. Marquez discussed NMAA sanctioning of rodeo. The feeling is that NMAA sanctioning was requested solely for the purpose of allowing students to participate and receive an excused absence from school. Concerns are that many rodeo teams do not have a school sponsor, which is required for NMAA activities and that rodeo has not been in attendance at NMAA Activities Council meetings for several years. Ms. Marquez stated that in looking at results from the State Rodeo competition, there were no schools listed only individual students. Many rodeo competitions are held on a Sunday and most school districts do not allow competitions on Sundays. The Board discussed the pros and cons of continued sanctioning of rodeo.

SB137 Non-Scholastic Athletic Certification form: Mr. Scott Owen, NMAA Assistant Director, discussed the certification form for schools to use in order to comply with SB137. The form would be signed by the Non-Scholastic entity to ensure they are complying with SB137 while using a school facility. The signed form would be kept on file at the school/district in order to verify the entity is in compliance and familiar with SB137. This would only be a requirement for non-scholastic youth groups utilizing a school facility. The Board discussed how the NMAA could communicate this information to member schools.

Football: Emergency Medical Personnel requirement: Mr. Dusty Young, NMAA Associate Director, requested the Board's opinion on requiring the presence of Emergency Medical crews at football games. The current NMAA bylaw requires Emergency Medical crews to be on call, but not present, at all athletic events. The Board discussed the pros and cons of the current bylaw.

Basketball: State Tournament Officials' Selection: Mr. David Osuna discussed the selection process for officials for the state basketball tournament.

Mr. Carpenter left the meeting at 11:01 am.

Break: 11:03 am - 11:15 am

#### **Action Items:**

Football: Adjust schedule submission deadline (7.15.1.F): (Referenda Item): Mr. Young presented a proposal to adjust the deadline within bylaw 7.15.1.F for football schedule submissions from April 15 to May 15. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Dr. Caton made the motion to accept

the proposal as presented. Dr. Cummins seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (9-0).

Football: Post game protocols for spectators: (Referenda Item): Mr. Young presented a proposal to consider limiting field access for spectators at the conclusion of football contests. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept the proposal. Mr. Green made the motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Martin seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (9-0).

Football: USA Football Heads Up Coach Certification: (Referenda Item): Mr. Young presented a proposal to require football coaches become nationally certified through USA Football's Heads Up Program. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Green made the motion to accept the proposal. Mr. Widner seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (9-0).

Baseball: Determining home team for State quarterfinals: Mr. Young presented a proposal to adjust NMAA baseball bylaws (7.12.4.B.5 & 7.12.4.C.6) so that the higher seed serves as the home team during the quarterfinal round of the State Baseball Championships. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to approve the proposal. Dr. Caton made the motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Carver seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (9-0).

Mr. Parson rejoined the meeting at 11:20 am.

Baseball: Individual Game Limitations-Courtesy Runner: (Referenda Item): Mr. Young presented a proposal to consider adding verbiage to baseball bylaw 7.12.1.C (game limitations) regarding courtesy runners. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Green made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Carver seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (10-0).

Baseball: Individual Game Limitations-Innings of Play: (Referenda Item): Mr. Young presented a proposal to consider adding verbiage to bylaw 7.12.1.C (game limitations) regarding innings of play. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Carver made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Parson seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (10-0).

Baseball: Use of wood / composite wood bats: (Referenda Item): Mr. Young presented a proposal to consider mandating the use of wood/composite wood bats in the sports of baseball. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Martin made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Widner seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (10-0).

Baseball: Pitching restriction regulations: (Referenda Item): Mr. Young presented a proposal to consider the implementation of new pitching restriction regulations (bylaw 7.12.1.D). Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Green made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Widner seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (10-0).

Mr. Martin and Mr. Widner left the meeting at 11:30 am.

Golf: Modify state qualifying formula to include slope: Mr. Bill Cleland, NMAA Associate Director, presented a proposal to include the use of slope rating to determine individual/team qualifying score requirements at each event. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Ms. Dodd made a

motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Parson seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Swim/Dive: Small school team champion: Mr. Cleland presented a proposal to continue with a combined A-6A state championship but to award a championship trophy to the A-4A high point team in each gender. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Green made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Parson seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Wrestling: Require the use of Track Wrestling software: (Referenda Item): Mr. Owen presented a proposal to require Track Wrestling (TW) software for all in-state varsity individual tournaments. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Carver made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Dr. Caton seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Wrestling: Adjustment to 4A and 5A State Qualifying: Mr. Owen presented a proposal to adjust 4A and 5A state qualifying numbers due to the new classification and alignment and the recent addition of Pojoaque to the sport. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Green made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Ms. Dodd seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Health / Safety Audit: Mr. Scott Evans, NMAA Assistant Director, presented a proposal to require all member high schools to complete a Student-athlete health and safety self-audit annually. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Ms. Dodd made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Parson seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Bylaw 3.10.2 – District Handbooks: (Referenda Item): Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to strike sentence two in bylaw 3.10.2 requiring district handbooks to be submitted annually to the NMAA. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Dr. Caton made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Ms. Dodd seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Bylaw 3.11.2 – Contract Agreements (emailing): (Referenda Item): Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to add electronic correspondence (email) as a binding contract to bylaw 3.11.2. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Green made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Ms. Dodd seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Bylaw 6.4.1 – Open Enrollment Choice: (Referenda Item): Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to allow students making a bona fide resident move into the state of New Mexico for the first time an open enrollment choice. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Green made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Casados seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Bylaw 6.6.2.G – Practice Regulations: (Referenda Item): Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to strike section G from bylaw 6.6.2 which disallows practice for reasons other than academic ineligibility. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Green made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Parson seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Bylaw 6.7.4 and 6.7.5 – Parent to Parent: (Referenda Item): Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to disallow the parent to parent provision for students transferring within the same or adjoining districts.

Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Carver made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Dr. Cummins seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Bylaw 6.8.1 – Eligibility Retention: (Referenda Item): Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to require a student who achieves initial eligibility as a bona fide resident or transfer student to remain at that school for 180 school/365 calendar days to utilize the eligibility retention exception. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Carver made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Parson seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Bylaw 6.9.2.B – Did not Participate: (Referenda Item): Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to allow 8<sup>th</sup>/9<sup>th</sup> grade transfer students and boarding students to utilize the "did not participate" exception. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Green made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Carver seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Bylaw 7.4 – Out of Season Coaching: (Referenda Item): Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to amend the out-of-season coaching bylaw to include only 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders who have made an open enrollment choice, to participate in out-of-season practices. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Mr. Casados made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Green seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Bylaw 8.1.7 – Home School Teams: (Referenda Item): Ms. Marquez presented a proposal to re-amend bylaw 8.1.7 (Home School Student Eligibility) to allow home school "teams" to participate in activities but with all former restrictions in place. Mr. Parks asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Dr. Caton made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mr. Carver seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

Mr. Parks asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 12:08 pm. Mr. Green made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Parson seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed unanimously (8-0).

For an appeal to be heard, current superintendents / headmasters of NMAA member schools must make up the majority of the Appeals Review Committee.
Proposal:
13.1.1- Any decision or determination made by the Director with respect to any matters set forth in this Handbook, of which a student is aggrieved, may be appealed to the Appeals Review Committee which is made up of current and /or retired superintendents or headmasters of NMAA member schools.
Rationale:
We are currently hearing appeals on a weekly basis. It is very difficult to get current Superintendents to be able to take part in all of the appeals due to time constraints. We currently have excellent "retired" Superintendents and Headmasters who understand NMAA bylaws that are willing to help weekly. At times, we may have retired Superintendents and Headmasters that make up the majority of the Appeals Committee.

#### 10.7 NON-MEMBER PRIVATE SCHOOL PARTICIPATION ELIGIBILITY

#### 10.7.1 Definition of a Private School

A school, other than a home school, that offers on-site programs of instruction and is not under the control, supervision or management of a local school board. The school is supported by a private organization or private individuals rather than by the government.

#### 10.7.2 Definition of a Non-Member Private School

A private school, as defined in 10.7.1, that is not a member of the New Mexico Activities Association.

## 10.7.3 Regulations for Non-Member Private School Student Participation in Public School of Student(s) Residence Attendance Zone

- A. Student's bona fide residence must be within the attendance area of the public school.
- B. Scholastic eligibility (GPA, failing grades, attendance) from the non-member private school must be verified based upon the latest official grade report.
- C. A complete, valid physical must be on file including all consent and information requirements from parents (including insurance provider).
- D. Verify all other NMAA requirements and guidelines (e.g. age, participation limits, amateur status, etc.) as specified in Section VI Eligibility (Bylaws) of the NMAA Handbook are met.

#### 10.7.4 Mutual Code of Conduct Agreement

A Code of Conduct/Discipline Agreement must be in writing and signed by the Student(s), the Student(s) parents, and both school administrators, a copy of which is to be kept on file at the Student(s) non-member private school as well as the public school in which the Student(s) is participating. The Student(s) must adhere to all code of conduct rules and regulations required of the students at the member school in which the Student(s) is participating.

#### 10.7.5 Physicals/Insurance/Catastrophic Insurance Requirements

Student participants must maintain an annual physical that is kept on file with both the non-member private and public schools. Student participants must also have proof of insurance coverage on file. (See Sections 6.15, 6.16)

#### 10.7.6 Transportation

Transportation to and from practice is the responsibility of the Student(s) participating on the team.

#### 10.7.7 On-Line Reporting

The public school fielding the team the Student(s) is participating with will be responsible for the on-line reporting.

### **Proposed Pitching Restriction Regulations**

Bylaw 7.12.1.D

1. At the varsity level, a pitcher may throw 120 pitches in any one day. At the sub-varsity level, a pitcher may throw 105 pitches in any one day. The pitcher will be allowed to finish a batter if they hit the maximum limit (120 in varsity, 105 in sub-varsity) during an at-bat, but must exit the game after the batter.

Once a pitcher exceeds the inning or pitch count thresholds, that player is considered an ineligible player and the game must be forfeited by the team in violation of these regulations. The school and/or head coach will also be subject to additional sanctions as determined by the Executive Director.

2. Coaches must post the pitch counts for all players from each game to MaxPreps, along with results, within 24 hours.

Failure to post pitch count numbers to MaxPreps within 24 hours will result in fines and/or other sanctions assessed to the school as determined by the Executive Director.

In addition to these maximum daily pitch counts, the following "days of rest" requirements shall be followed:

\*\*Rest Periods (varsity & sub-varsity)

Pitches	Required Rest
91+	4 Calendar Days
61-90	3 Calendar Days
41-60	1 Calendar Day
0-40	0 Calendar Days

Calendar day = If a pitcher throws 85 pitches on Tuesday, that player should not pitch again until Saturday (3 required calendar days of rest).

Consecutive Day Note – if a player pitches on consecutive days, the cumulative pitch count from those two days should be used to calculate the required rest period. Example = Pitcher A throws 27 pitches on Friday and 35 pitches on Saturday, which is 62 pitches cumulatively – required rest after day two would be 3 calendar days.

- \*\* Once a pitcher is removed, consideration should be given to the position he is assigned once he is done pitching. Consideration should be given to the throwing requirement of the fielding position once the pitcher vacates the mound.
- \*\*Develop a pitching philosophy that includes the instruction in proper throwing mechanics, broadening the number of players who will become pitchers on their staffs, and developing a "work up" plan so that a pitcher is not throwing the maximum allowable pitches from the first day of competition (i.e., no more than 65 pitches in weeks 1-3, no more than 85 in weeks 4-6 to allow for growth and arm strength to develop.)



### **Proposed Pitching Restriction Regulations**

Bylaw 9.8.1.C.3

1. At the middle school / junior high level, a pitcher may throw 90 pitches in any one day. The pitcher will be allowed to finish a batter if they hit the maximum limit (90) during an at-bat, but must exit the game after the batter.

Once a pitcher exceeds the inning or pitch count thresholds, that player is considered an ineligible player and the game must be forfeited by the team in violation of these regulations. The school and/or head coach will also be subject to additional sanctions as determined by the Executive Director.

2. Coaches must keep a written record of all pitch counts for each player for all games. This information should be kept on file with the head coach and also reported to the school administration.

In addition to this maximum daily pitch count, the following "days of rest" requirements shall be followed:

#### \*\*Rest Periods

Pitches	Required Rest
81+	4 Calendar Days
61-80	3 Calendar Days
41-60	2 Calendar Days
21-40	1 Calendar Day
0-20	0 Calendar Days

Calendar day = If a pitcher throws 65 pitches on Tuesday, that player should not pitch again until Saturday (3 required calendar days of rest).

Consecutive Day Note – if a player pitches on consecutive days, the cumulative pitch count from those two days should be used to calculate the required rest period. Example = Pitcher A throws 27 pitches on Friday and 25 pitches on Saturday, which is 52 pitches cumulatively – required rest after day two would be 2 calendar days.

\*\* Once a pitcher is removed, consideration should be given to the position he is assigned once he is done pitching. Consideration should be given to the throwing requirement of the fielding position once the pitcher vacates the mound.

\*\*Develop a pitching philosophy that includes the instruction in proper throwing mechanics, broadening the number of players who will become pitchers on their staffs, and developing a "work up" plan so that a pitcher is not throwing the maximum allowable pitches from the first day of competition (i.e., no more than 50 pitches in weeks 1-3, no more than 70 in weeks 4-6 to allow for growth and arm strength to develop.)

#### **Proposal:**

Amend current seeding policy to utilize Trackwrestling's automated seeding matrix to assign individual seeds in each weight class.

#### 7.24.5.C.1 State Tournament Brackets - Current

"A seeding committee as established by district dual meet placement shall determine seeds in each weight class."

#### 7.24.5.C.1 State Tournament Brackets - Proposed

"Seeds in each weight class shall be determined by Trackwrestling software. A seeding committee as established by district dual meet placement shall verify the seeds."

#### **Rationale:**

- 1. Expedites seeding process by utilizing individual results already entered into the TW system throughout the year and uses that info along with set criteria as established by the state association to create automated seeds.
- 2. Seeding system is preferred to the current system due to the fact it takes a holistic view of a wrestler's season and compares his body of work against all other wrestlers vying for a seed.
- 3. Has positive future implications which include:
  - a. Releasing brackets earlier in the week to generate publicity
  - b. Removing the need for a face-to-face seeding meeting the night before the event
  - c. Alleviating potential travel stress and expenses

#### **DISTRICT MEETINGS**

Meetings of wrestling coaches within each district are held prior to the state seeding meeting:

- 1. **Designate representatives** to the state seeding committee. In 2 and 3 team districts, the coach of the championship team shall be the representative. In 4, 5, and 6 team districts, the coaches of the championship team and runner-up team shall be the representatives.
- 2. **Provide the** district representative(s) with the **detailed varsity record** (using the attached form or a computer generated data sheet with the same information) for each individual to be seeded.
- 3. Determine a priority for seeding of individuals in same weight class from their district.
- 4. **Provide the** district representative(s) with the **seed number** they desire for each individual.

#### **STATE MEETING**

A seeding meeting is conducted under the direction and supervision of the NMAA on Thursday preceding the State Tournament. Only head coaches or a designee may attend the meeting. If the school is not represented, the district champion coach represents the absent coach in case of a criteria tie (see E. below). No wrestler is considered for seeding if the detailed varsity record form is not completed properly and submitted to the district representative(s). Seeding is conducted by a **committee** composed of district representatives. The tournament director (authorized by NMAA) may appoint others to assist with the process as necessary. Verification of entries will take place at the seeding meeting.

#### **PROCESS**

- A. Six individuals are seeded in each weight class in 6A and 5A, four in 4A.
- B. District representatives nominate individuals for a desired seed. (no minimum # of matches; once nominated, individuals cannot be withdrawn from consideration for seeding)
- C. Seeding is based on the greater number of the following three criteria\* (no order or priority):
  - 1. **Best overall percentage record** (must have wrestled a minimum of twelve (12) varsity matches this season; record to include all varsity matches in all weights)
  - 2. Competition results\*\*
    - a. Head-to-head, then
    - b. records against common opponents
  - 3. Returning state place winner\*\*
    - a. higher place in most recent state tournament
    - b. multiple year place winner
  - \* Note in situations where 3 or more wrestlers are under consideration, credit for any criteria is applicable only when it applies to all wrestlers under consideration.
  - \*\*Note In 2. and 3. above, "a" determines the award of criteria if present; if criteria is not earned in accordance with "a.", then "b." is considered
- D. If the greater number of criteria in "C" above does not determine a seed, the following weighted criteria\* is used in the following order:
  - 1. **Competition results** head to head only
  - 2. **Returning state place winner** higher place in most recent tournament
  - 3. **Best overall percentage record** (must have twelve matches min. see C.1.)
  - \* Note in situations where 3 or more wrestlers are under consideration, credit for any criteria is applicable only when it applies to all wrestlers under consideration.
- E. If a **tie** remains, each coach is given 45 seconds to present his wrestler. At the conclusion of the presentations, a vote of the seeding committee is called. Each coach on the committee votes independently based on the information presented. In case of a tie vote, the seed is determined by a coin toss.

#### **DISTRICT MEETINGS**

Meetings of wrestling coaches within each district are held prior to the state seeding meeting:

- 1. Designate representatives to the state seeding committee. Representatives are selected based on the results of the district dual meets. The coaches of the championship team and runner-up team shall be the representatives.
- 2. Verify varsity records and results for state qualifying athletes.

#### **STATE MEETING**

A seeding meeting is conducted under the direction and supervision of the NMAA on Thursday preceding the State Tournament. **Only head coaches or a designee may attend the meeting.** If the school is not represented, the district champion coach represents the absent coach. Seeding is overseen by a **committee** composed of district representatives. The tournament director (authorized by NMAA) may appoint others to assist with the process as necessary. Verification of entries will take place at the seeding meeting.

#### **PROCESS**

- A. Six individuals are seeded in each weight class in 6A and 5A, four in A-4A.
- B. Trackwrestling software will be used to seed all weight classes.
- C. NMAA Wrestling Seeding Rules are as follows:
  - 1. All wrestlers with a .500 record or better are considered for a seed.
  - 2. Schools wishing for wrestlers below .500 to be considered for a seed must request inclusion in the seeding process prior to running the seeding report.
  - 3. Criteria points are earned against all wrestlers considered for a seed in the following priority order:
    - a. Head-to-head results
    - b. Records against common opponents
    - c. **Returning state place** (most recent state tournament)
    - d. Best overall percentage record (must have wrestled a minimum of twelve (12) varsity matches this season; record to include all varsity matches in all weights)
  - 4. The wrestler with the most "points" earns the one seed. The wrestler with the second most points earns the two seed, etc.
  - 5. Tie breaking procedures are as follows:
    - a. If two individuals are tied on points they will be compared alone and awarded seeds based on the priority criteria procedure listed above.
    - b. If three or more individuals are tied on points they will be compared alone and awarded seeds first using returning state place and then best overall percentage record if a tie is not broken by returning state place.
    - c. If three or more individuals remain tied the seeding committee shall vote on the order of seeds. In case of a tie vote, the seeds are determined by a coin toss or draw of lots.
